

I, Wish Evans, a citizen of Madison County, Mississippi, being over the age of twenty one years, and of sound, disposing mind, memory and understanding, and being desirous of disposing of my worldly possessions, do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me made.

Item 1. I desire all my just debts promptly paid.

Item. 2. I hereby appoint my sons William Evans and Bradford Evans the executors of this will; or either one of them may act in that capacity; and they shall not report to any Court as such and they shall not be required to give any bond.

Item 3. It is my will that my wife Hattie Evans shall continue to live in my house where she now lives with me as long as she may live; and, further, that my sons William and Bradford shall provide for her support and other needs in the manner and to the extent I have provided for her all along, so that she may live comfortably and happily as I would want her to live. In addition I will to her the sum of five hundred dollars cash.

Item 4. All of the rest of my personal property, with the exception of one red horse name Ted which I here will to Ray Vance Griffin, I will and bequeath to my said sons William Evans and Bradford Evans.

Item 5. I devise, will and bequeath to Frank Evans, Maggie Brandon, Rosie Lee Williams, Wish Evans, Jr., Mary Bell Griffin and Susie B. Tharpe, each twenty five acres of land out of my place near Sulphur Springs in said County, for the term of their natural life or lives; and at the death of each of them their said interests, or twenty five acres, shall go to the heirs of their body. However, the said twenty five acres each shall be pointed out and allotted to them by my said sons William and Bradford Evans; and the selections as made by them shall be final and binding; or in case of the death of either William or Bradford, the survivor of them shall make the selections or designations.

6. All the remainder of my real estate, wheresoever the same may be located or situated, I hereby will and bequeath to my said sons William Evans and Bradford Evans.

Item 7. I want it thoroly understood that the twenty five acres each heretofore in item five bequeathed to the six named children shall be selected by my two above named sons as heretofore provided for; and that there shall be no appeal from the selection or selections so made for them by the said William and Bradford Evans, who I know will do the just and equitable thing.

8. It is my desire that my said two sons William and Bradford shall have the full use and control of all the lands not allotted to the said six children and may farm and use same in any way they may desire for their own use. And, of course, they shall support my wife Hattie as indicated above as long as she remains in the house with them as she now resides.

9. It is my wish that D.C.McCool, attorney, shall be engaged to have this will legally probated at my death.

I, DAVID LEE SUTHERLAND, a resident of the State of Minnesota, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this instrument to be my Last Will and Testament, and I hereby revoke all former wills and codicils heretofore made by me.

ARTICLE ONE

I direct my executors hereinafter named to pay out of my estate the following:

1. All administration expenses of my estate;
2. All expenses of my last illness, funeral and burial;
3. All inheritance, estate, succession, transfer and other taxes which may be imposed on my estate or on any person by the United States of America or by any state or territory thereof or by any foreign government by reason of the transfer or receipt of property from me, including (but not by way of limitation on the foregoing) all such taxes arising from the transfer or receipt of property included in my probate estate, of proceeds of insurance or annuity policies on my life, of property in which I have at my death any interest as joint tenant, co-owner or otherwise, of property transferred by me prior to my death, and of property subject to my power of appointment; it being my express intention and direction that my executors shall not be entitled to reimbursement from any person or persons for such taxes;
4. All of my just debts allowed as claims against my estate.

ARTICLE TWO

To my wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, if she survives me, I give and bequeath all of my motor vehicles, household goods and furnishings, books, paintings, jewelry, ornaments, guns and sports equipment, motion picture and other photographic equipment and all of my other personal effects; and if my said wife does not survive me, then all of such property I give and bequeath to my daughter, Mary Sutherland Patchell; and if neither my said wife nor daughter survives me, I give and bequeath the same to the issue of my said daughter, if any such issue survives me, and if no such issue survives me to David Hubbard Sutherland, the son of my deceased cousin, Louis C. Sutherland, formerly of Walla Walla, Washington.

ARTICLE THREE

To my wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, if she survives me, I give, devise and bequeath any and all real estate situate within the State of Minnesota of which I die seized or possessed, including all buildings thereon, together with any and all my rights and interests in any and all such real estate, together with all bonds and shares of stock issued by Encampment Forest Association (a Minnesota corporation), all my rights and interests under any leases or other agreements with said Encampment Forest Association and all my right, title, interest and share in and to any and all property now or hereafter owned, held or controlled by said Encampment Forest Association; and if my said wife does not survive me, then all of such property I give, devise and bequeath to my said daughter, Mary Sutherland Patchell; and if neither of them survives me, I give, devise and bequeath all of said property to my brother, J. Frederick Sutherland; and if neither my said wife, daughter, nor brother survives me, all of said property shall be dealt with as a part of the residue of my estate as hereinafter provided.

ARTICLE FOUR

I give, devise and bequeath to my trustees hereinafter named and to their successors, in trust for the uses and purposes hereinafter specified, an amount equal to one-half (1/2) of my adjusted gross estate as defined for Federal Estate Tax purposes. For the purpose of determining what is an amount equal to one-half (1/2) of my adjusted gross estate, the Federal Estate Tax Return made by my executors shall be conclusive. If my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, does not survive me, then in addition to said amount equal to one-half (1/2) of my adjusted gross estate, I give, devise and bequeath all of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate and property, real, personal and mixed, to my said trustees and their successors for said uses and purposes. My said trustees shall hold and distribute the income and principal of the trust created by this ARTICLE FOUR as hereinafter specified and subject to the following terms and conditions:

FIRST: All of the net income of said trust shall be paid and distributed to my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, in convenient installments, not less often than quarterly, as long as she lives.

SECOND: Upon the death of my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, all of the net income of said trust shall be paid in convenient installments, not less often than quarterly, to the children of my said daughter, Mary Sutherland Patchell, in equal shares, and the issue of any deceased child of my said daughter shall take its parent's share of such income by right of representation. Whenever any child of my said daughter or its issue shall have received all of its share of the principal of said trust, payment of income from said trust to such child or its issue shall cease; and whenever any child of my said daughter or its issue shall have received part of its share of the principal, such child

or its issue shall thereafter be paid income only from the balance of its share of the principal remaining in said trust.

THIRD: Upon the death of my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, and at all times thereafter during the lifetime of my said daughter when she has no issue living, my trustees shall pay to my said daughter, Mary Sutherland Patchell, all of the net income of said trust, in convenient installments, not less often than quarterly, as long as she lives.

FOURTH: None of the principal of said trust shall be distributed prior to the death of my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland; and upon her death the principal of said trust shall be divided into equal shares, one (1) such share for each then living child of my said daughter, Mary Sutherland Patchell, and one (1) such share for the issue of each child of my said daughter who is then deceased; and one-half (1/2) of the share of each such child of my said daughter shall be paid to it when it attains the age of twenty-five (25) years and the balance thereof shall be paid to it when it attains the age of thirty (30) years; and the share of any child of my said daughter who is deceased shall be paid to the issue of such child, by right of representation, at the same dates as the parent of such issue would have been entitled to receive the same, were such parent living. In case any child of my said daughter dies without issue surviving it, the principal share of such deceased child remaining undistributed shall go to augment ratably the shares apportionable to the other children of my said daughter, including, by right of representation, the issue of any deceased child of my said daughter.

FIFTH: Upon the death of the survivor of my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, and all of my issue, if there is any part of said trust then remaining undistributed, it shall be distributed as follows:

1. Twenty per cent (20%) thereof shall be distributed to Plymouth Congregational Church, of Minneapolis, Minnesota.
 2. Eighty per cent (80%) thereof shall be distributed, in equal shares, to David Hubbard Sutherland, George Sutherland, John Sutherland and Louis C. Sutherland, Jr. (the sons of my deceased cousin, Louis C. Sutherland, formerly of Walla Walla, Washington); and the issue of any of them who is deceased shall take the deceased parent's share by right of representation.
 3. The share of any of said David Hubbard Sutherland, George Sutherland, John Sutherland and Louis C. Sutherland, Jr. who is deceased and has no issue surviving at the time of distribution shall go to augment ratably the shares apportionable to the others, including, by right of representation, the issue of any of them who is deceased.
 4. All or any part of the remainder of said trust not distributed under the provisions of subdivision FOURTH of this ARTICLE FOUR or under the provisions of sections 1, 2 and 3 of this subdivision FIFTH, shall be distributed to the persons who would be my heirs-at-law if I were to have died intestate at the time of termination of said trust, as such heirship is determined by the laws of the State of Minnesota then in force.

SIXTH: The trust hereby created shall terminate upon the happening of whichever of the following events shall first occur:

1. Upon the final distribution of all of said trust as above provided in subdivision FOURTH of this ARTICLE FOUR.
2. Upon the expiration of twenty-one (21) years from the date of the death of the survivor of my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, and all of my issue living at the time of my death; at the end of which time distribution

of all of said trust then remaining shall be made as above provided in subdivision FOURTH of this ARTICLE FOUR, without regard to any provision hereof which might postpone distribution beyond such time; or if no issue of mine is then surviving, distribution shall be made as above provided in subdivision FIFTH of this ARTICLE FOUR.

SEVENTH: My trustees, in their absolute discretion, may make payment of any income payable to any beneficiary of the trust created by this ARTICLE FOUR in any one or more of the following ways, to-wit: (1) directly to the beneficiary, (2) to the legal or natural guardian of the beneficiary, (3) to any person who shall have the custody and care of the person of the beneficiary, or (4) directly for the expense of the maintenance, care, support, education, comfort, traveling expenses, recreation or general welfare of the beneficiary. My trustees shall not be obliged to see to the application of funds paid in any such way, and the receipt of any such person to whom they are so paid shall be full acquittance and discharge of my trustees.

EIGHTH: Neither the principal nor income of the trust created by this ARTICLE FOUR shall be liable for the debts of any beneficiary, and no beneficiary shall have any power to sell, assign, transfer, encumber or in any other manner to anticipate or dispose of his or her interest in either the principal or income of said trust prior to the actual distribution and delivery thereof by my trustees to such beneficiary.

NINTH: Should any real estate ever become or be decreed to be a part of the property of the trust created by this ARTICLE FOUR, and in case a sale thereof should be necessary in order to make or keep said trust valid according to law, I direct my trustees to sell such real estate and convert it into personal property as soon as such conversion can be made without sacrifice and thereafter

to keep the proceeds thereof invested only in personal property during the term of said trust.

ARTICLE FIVE

If my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, survives me, then all of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate and property, real, personal and mixed, I give, devise and bequeath to my trustees hereinafter named and to their successors, to be held in a separate trust from the one created by ARTICLE FOUR hereof for the following uses and purposes and subject to the following terms and conditions:

FIRST: All of the income of the trust created by this ARTICLE FIVE shall be paid to my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, in convenient installments, but not less often than quarterly, as long as she lives.

SECOND: At any time after my death, my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, alone shall have the absolute and unrestricted right and power, exercisable only in and by her last will and testament, to appoint to her estate, or to such party or parties as she may designate in her said will, the entire corpus of said trust created by this ARTICLE FIVE and all undistributed income therefrom. If my said wife exercises said power of appointment given and granted to her hereby, then upon her death the entire corpus of said trust created by this ARTICLE FIVE and all undistributed income therefrom shall be paid to her estate or to such party or parties as she shall have designated in her last will and testament, free of this trust; but if my said wife does not exercise said power of appointment, then upon her death all undistributed income of said trust to the date of her death shall be paid to her estate and the principal of said trust shall be added to the trust created



by ARTICLE FOUR hereof and shall be thereafter held, paid and distributed by my trustees as part of the trust created by ARTICLE FOUR hereof in the same manner as provided therein.

THIRD: My trustees, in their sole discretion, shall have the right and power to pay to my said wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, from the principal of said trust, such amounts for her maintenance, care, support, comfort, traveling expenses, recreation or general welfare as my trustees deem advisable, not exceeding ten per cent (10%) of the principal of said trust in any one calendar year.

ARTICLE SIX

I hereby nominate and appoint my brother, J. Frederick Sutherland, of Minneapolis, Minnesota and Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis (a national banking association with its principal place of business in Minneapolis, Minnesota) as executors of this my last will and testament and as trustees of the trusts hereby created. In case of the death or resignation of my said brother or in case of his inability or refusal to act, I direct that C. A. Taney, Jr. of Minneapolis, Minnesota, be appointed to act in place of my brother as such executor and trustee. In case of the death or resignation of both my brother and C. A. Taney, Jr. or in case both of them are unable or refuse to act, I direct that such person as is designated in writing by my wife, Alice Robinson Sutherland, be appointed to act as such executor and trustee. I hereby direct that neither my said brother nor said C. A. Taney, Jr. be required to give any bond as such executor or as such trustee.

ARTICLE SEVEN

My executors and trustees and their successors shall have all of the rights, powers, duties and discretions given them or imposed on them by law or by this instrument, and without limiting

the generality of the foregoing, I hereby give and grant unto my executors and trustees, whichever may be acting from time to time, and to their successors, the following rights, powers, duties and discretions, subject only to the limitations expressed in this instrument:

1. To receive and collect the principal, income, rents, issues and profits of any and all property in my estate or in the trusts hereby created.
2. To sell, convey, transfer, assign, lease, mortgage, pledge, encumber, exchange or otherwise dispose of all or any of the property in my estate or in either of the trusts hereby created, for such considerations and upon such terms and conditions and in such manner as they may deem advisable and proper and for terms within or extending beyond the period of administration of my estate or beyond the duration of either of the trusts hereby created, without the order, direction or license of any court and without notice to or the consent of any person or party whatsoever; and to make, execute and deliver any and all instruments necessary, proper or expedient to the exercise of all or any of said powers. No purchaser or other person dealing with my executors or trustees shall be required to ascertain the validity of any act purporting to be done by them, nor to see to the application of any money or other consideration paid or transferred to them.
3. To vote all stocks and to exercise all rights and powers incident to the ownership of stocks, bonds, notes and other securities or properties in my estate or in either of the trusts hereby created and to issue proxies to vote such stocks and to exercise such rights and powers; to sell or exercise any stockholders' subscription rights and to sell

or retain any stock dividends, but all such subscription rights and stock dividends constituting income of the trust created by ARTICLE FIVE hereof, or the proceeds thereof, shall be paid or delivered to my said wife as income of said trust; to consent to or join in any plans of reorganization, readjustment, merger or consolidation in respect to any corporation whose stocks, bonds, notes or other securities are a part of my estate or of either of the trusts hereby created, including becoming a member of any stockholders', bondholders' or other similar committee; to accept and hold any new securities issued pursuant to any such plan of reorganization, readjustment, merger or consolidation; to pay any assessments on stocks or other securities in my estate or in either of the trusts hereby created or to relinquish the same; and to otherwise exercise any and all rights and powers and deal in and with any and all such property in the same manner and to the same extent as an individual owner thereof might do.

4. To deposit reasonable amounts of the funds of my estate or of either of said trusts in bank accounts in the commercial or savings department of the corporate executor or trustee or in any other reliable bank or trust company.
5. To make division or distribution of my estate or of the trust created by ARTICLE FOUR hereof as required herein in money, securities or other property; and the judgment of my executors or trustees, whichever may be acting, as to the valuations of the properties or securities concerned in making such division or distribution shall be binding and conclusive on all parties in interest.

6. To invest and reinvest all principal funds coming into my estate or either of the trusts hereby created in such stocks, bonds, notes, mortgages or other securities or personal property (but not real estate) as my executors or trustees, whichever may be acting, may deem advisable or proper, whether authorized by statute for the investment of trust funds or not, and to change such investments from time to time in such manner and form as my executors or trustees, whichever may be acting, may deem advisable or proper. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions or any statutory provisions on the subject, neither my executors nor my trustees shall at any time purchase for my estate or for either of said trusts any securities or other property from himself or itself, nor from any company affiliated or associated with any corporate executor or trustee acting hereunder, nor from any company owned or controlled by any individual executor or trustee, nor from any company with the active management of which any individual executor or trustee is connected; but shall invariably make such purchases from others.
 7. My executors and trustees shall be under no obligation to change the investments which come into their hands from my estate on account of the character thereof, except when they deem it advisable to do so after careful consideration and investigation and except as may be required by other provisions hereof.
 8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, it is my desire that my executors and trustees do not sell or dispose of any Keystone Fund Certificates (of which The Keystone Company of Boston is the principal underwriter) which may be a part

ARTICLE EIGHT

Wherever used in this instrument, the words "child", "children" and "issue" shall be construed to exclude any and all adopted children and to include only the legitimate children, grandchildren and great grandchildren of the testator.

ARTICLE NINE

In the event that any provision or provisions of this instrument are or are adjudged to be for any reason unenforceable or unlawful, the remainder thereof, disregarding such provisions, shall remain and be carried into effect.


