All the rest and residue of my estate, I give, bequeath and devise to the Deposit Guaranty Bank & Trust Company of Jackson, Mississippi, in trust for the following uses and purposes, to-wit:

A. The Trustee shall pay to my daughter, Helen Simpson Omohundro, the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) per year so long as she may live, and, in the event of the protracted illness or other disability of my said daughter or her husband, or in the event of other emergency or casualty, the Trustee may, in its absolute discretion, pay over to her additional amounts to aid in alleviating such condition. Said payments shall terminate on the death of my said daughter, but if her husband survive her, the Trustee shall pay over to him for the remainder of his life one-fourth (1/4) of the net income of the trust estate remaining after payment of the other legacies provided for in this Item VIII of my Will.

B. The Trustee shall pay to Mrs. Mamie McDowell the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per year so long as she may live, the first

of such payments to be made as soon after my death as is reasonably possible and the remaining payments to be made annually thereafter; and in the event of protracted illness or other disability or casualty, the Trustee may pay additional amounts to her, the amounts of such payments and conditions under which the same are to be paid being left to the sound discretion of the Trustee.

C. The Trustee shall pay to my sister, Mrs. Mattie Haley, One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month, so long as she may live, the first payment to be made as soon after my death as is reasonably possible and the remaining payments to be made monthly thereafter; and in the event of protracted illness or other disability or casualty, the Trustee may pay additional amounts to her, the amounts of such payments and conditions under which the same are to be paid being left to the sound discretion of the Trustee.

D. The Trustee shall pay to my nephew, Robert B. (Jay) Crisler and his wife Martha, One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month, so long as either of them shall live.

E. The Trustee shall pay to Elizabeth J. Crisler, the wife of my nephew S. J. (Doc) Crisler, and in the event of her death to some other suitable person to be selected by the Trustee, the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per month for each of her three children until each of said children shall arrive at the age of twenty-five (25) years; to be used for the support and education of said children; and, in addition thereto, the Trustee may defray the necessary actual expenses of any of said children who desire a college education while regularly attending a college or university for a period not to exceed four years after finishing high school, so long as the school work done by such child or children is satisfactory to the Trustee. Provided, however, that if the college education of any of said children shall be interrupted by a period of military service, the time for payment of such expenses shall be extended for a like period.

F. The Trustee shall have the right to supplement the income from the principal of this trust in the event it becomes necessary to do so for

the payment of any of the annuities or other payments provided for in this item of my Will.

G. This trust shall continue during the lifetime of all of the persons herein named who are to receive lifetime annuities therefrom and until the payments for the benefit of the children of my nephew S. J. (Doc) Crisler herein provided for have been completed. However, on the death of my daughter, Helen Simpson Omehundro, and at such other times either before or after such event as the Trustee in its sound discretion may deem it expedient so to do, the Trustee shall make a partial distribution of the trust estate to the ultimate beneficiaries thereof, and the trust shall terminate and final distribution shall be made when all of the recipients of lifetime annuities herein named shall have died and when the payments provided for in paragraph "F" of this item shall have been completed. Such distributions shall be made to my daughter Lillian Simpson Bottrell to be by her distributed to my next of kin other than my two daughters, as she may deem best, and should my said daughter Lillian not be living, the Trustee shall make such distributions direct to my next of kin other than my daughter, determined as of the date of such distribution according to the law of descent and distribution of the State of Mississippi.

ITEM IX.

No beneficiary of this trust shall have the right, power or authority to anticipate any payments of income or corpus from this trust fund, nor shall any one of them have the power or authority to pledge, appoint or create any lien or encumbrance against, sell, transfer, assign, convey, give or otherwise dispose of any part of the income or corpus of this trust fund until same has been delivered unto the beneficiaries by the Trustee, freed from the terms and conditions of this trust, nor shall any part of said income or corpus of said trust fund be liable for the debts of any beneficiary or be subject to execution, attachment, garnishment, or any other process of law or equity while in the hands of the Trustee.

ITEM X.

In addition to the power, privileges, titles and obligations heretofore vested in the Executor and Trustee, said Executor and Trustee shall be vested with the following power, privileges, title and obligations, to-wit:

1. To retain any property of my estate, or any undivided interest therein, regardless of any lack of diversification, risk, or non-productivity;
2. To invest and reinvest the trust estate in any property or undivided interests therein, wherever located, including bonds, notes - secured or unsecured - stocks of corporations, real estate or any interest therein and interests in trust, including common trust funds, without being limited by any statute or rule of law concerning investments by trustees;
3. To sell any trust property for cash or on credit, at public or private sale; to exchange any trust property for other property; to grant options to purchase or acquire any trust property; and to determine the prices and terms of sales, exchanges and options;
4. To execute leases and sub-leases for terms as long as fifty (50) years, even though such terms may extend beyond the termination of the trust; to subdivide or improve real estate and tear down or alter improvements; to grant easements, to give consents and make contracts relating to real estate or its use; and to release or dedicate any interest in real estate;
5. To borrow money from time to time and for any such purpose, to mortgage or pledge any trust property;
6. To take any action with respect to conserving or realizing upon the value of any trust property, and with respect to foreclosures, reorganizations or other changes affecting the trust property; to collect, pay, contest, compromise or abandon demands of or against the trust estate, wherever situated; and to execute contracts, notes, conveyances and other instruments, including instruments containing covenants and warranties binding upon and creating a charge against the trust estate, and containing provisions excluding personal liability;
7. To keep any property in the name of a nominee with or without disclosure of any fiduciary relationship;

8. To employ agents, attorneys, auditors, depositaries and proxies, with or without discretionary powers;

9. To determine the manner of ascertainment of income and principal, and the apportionment between income and principal of all receipts and disbursements, and to select any accounting period;

10. To receive additional property from any source and add it to and commingle it with the trust estate;

11. To enter into any transaction authorized by this item with Trustees or legal representatives of any other trust or estate in which any beneficiary hereunder has any beneficial interest, even though any such trustee or legal representative is also trustee hereunder;

12. To make any distribution or division of the trust property in cash or in kind or both, and to allot different kinds or disproportionate shares of property or undivided interests in property among the beneficiaries or portions, and to determine the value of any such property; and to continue to exercise any powers and discretion herein given for a reasonable period after the termination of the trust but only for so long as no rule of law relating to perpetuities would be violated;

13. To exercise any or all conversion, subscription, voting and other rights, privileges, elections and options pertaining to any such property, and to grant proxies, discretionary or otherwise, in respect thereof; and to receive and retain any property that may be acquired by it as the result of the exercise of any such rights, privileges, elections or options;

14. To extend the time of payment of any obligations, including accrued or accruing interest, held by it hereunder;

15. To make partition, division or distribution of property in kind and, for any such purpose, to determine the value of any such property, which determination, however, shall be subject to approval thereof by any court having jurisdiction;

16. To execute oil, gas and mineral leases, royalty and mineral deeds or other contracts and agreements pertaining to minerals or royalties,

covering or pertaining to any trust property on such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable;

17. To perform any and all such other acts and to take any and all such other proceedings, and to exercise all such other rights and privileges in respect of any property as if it were the absolute owner thereof and, in connection therewith, to enter into any and all agreements binding my estate or any trust hereunder.

ITEM XI.

Should another corporation succeed to the business of my Executor and Trustee either before or after my death, such successor shall become Executor and Trustee hereunder. Should my Executor and Trustee herein named resign or be unable to act, my daughter Lillian Simpson Bottrell, and, in the event of her death, her husband Dan Bottrell, may appoint as successor a corporation doing business in Mississippi and authorized under the laws of Mississippi, or of the United States, to act as such Executor or Trustee or both, by instrument of writing executed and filed in the cause in which my estate may be administered in the Chancery Court of said County, which successor shall be vested with all of the powers conferred on the Executor and Trustee herein named.
