
1. It is my desire, and I do hereby direct my executor to pay all my just debts, including my funeral expenses and expenses of my last illness, as soon after my death as conveniently done.

8. To my cousin ROBERT G. NICHOLS, JR., all of my automobiles, all of my cameras and the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) cash.

9. To the YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION of Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee, my movie projector, screen and film of my world cruise.

10. To my friend KAY LEAHY my diamond and pearl bracelet, ring and earrings.

11. To my sisters, MILDRED HILL GUY and FRANCES HILL SIMPSON, and my friend BLANCHE BERGERE all of my fur coats and clothing to be divided equally among them by my Executor in such manner as my Executor may see fit, in the Executor's discretion, undertaking, insofar as the same is possible, to make an equal

and equitable distribution but the Executor is neither directed nor required to see to an equal distribution among those named but is required only to use the best judgment of the Executor in the division.

12. All of the rest, residue and remainder of my property, real, personal or mixed, other than the specific bequests hereinabove set out, I give, devise and bequeath as follows:

A. One-third (1/3) to the YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION of Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee. I recommend but do not require that this bequest, in the discretion of the Board of Directors, be merged and mingled with the endowment fund of the association. If, however, the Board of Directors deem it advisable in their discretion so to do, this bequest may be merged and mingled with and become a part of the general investment assets, or sold, or reinvested or used as the Board of Directors in their sole discretion may determine.

B. The remaining two-thirds (2/3) to UNION PLANTERS NATIONAL BANK, as Trustee, for my sisters, MILDRED HILL GUY and FRANCES HILL SIMPSON. I direct that my said Trustee shall pay to each of my said sisters Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per month so long as each shall live and at the death of the last of the two the balance and remainder of this trust fund, if any, to the AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY.

The said Trustee shall have the rights, powers, privileges and immunities usually possessed and exercised by Trustees, and without restricting such rights, powers, privileges and immunities, is expressly empowered:

(1) To retain as part of the trust estate any and all property, real, personal or mixed, originally coming into its hands, whether or not such property is a legal investment for trustees.

(2) To sell and convey, in whole or in part, in such manner and upon such terms as to it seems advisable, any or all property, real, personal or mixed, constituting a part of the trust estate, without approval of any court and without liability

upon any person dealing with it to see to the application of the money or property delivered to it.

(3) To join in or to make leases, with or without option to purchase, on any real estate forming a part of the trust estate for any term even though they may extend beyond the termination of the trust, and such leases shall be binding upon all beneficiaries hereunder.

(4) To maintain insurance, make repairs and improvements to property and otherwise protect and preserve the property constituting a part of the trust estate or the ownership thereof.

(5) To exchange property for other property without the necessity of authorization or approval of any court.

(6) To compromise, contest, submit to arbitration or otherwise settle any and all claims in favor of or against the trust estate or the Trustee.

(7) To borrow money upon the security of the trust estate, and to mortgage or encumber or pledge such part or all of the trust estate as it may deem advisable.

(8) To vote in person or by proxy upon any item of security or property forming a part of the trust estate; to agree to the reorganization, merger, or consolidation of any corporation whose stock it holds as Trustee, and to unite, in its discretion, with other owners of similar property in carrying out any plan, making any change, giving any assent, and paying any sums of money affecting such securities or property, and generally, to exercise in respect thereof, the same rights and powers as are or may be lawfully exercised by persons owning similar property in their own right, and incident thereto, to accept in exchange for such stock or securities or other property, other stock, securities or property, whether legal investments or not, in such reorganized or new corporations.

(9) To invest and reinvest funds in its hands in stocks, bonds, mortgages, real estate or other income producing property, as in its judgment it may direct, but it shall not be limited or restricted to investing said funds in properties or securities

designated as legal investments for trust funds by the laws of the State of Tennessee.

(10) To employ counsel when in its discretion such employment is deemed advisable.

(11) To make distribution of the assets of the trust estate, either income or principal, in cash or in kind, or partly in cash and partly in kind.

(12) To consider all stock dividends or stock splits as corpus and not to distribute them as income.

III

No beneficiary under this Last Will and Testament shall have the right or power to alienate, dispose of, anticipate or, in any way, encumber or create a charge upon the income or other benefits or bequests to which he or she is entitled under any of the foregoing provisions of this Last Will and Testament, and the same shall not be subject to attachment, or be liable to be taken over, for his or her debts, by any legal process whatever.

IV

I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved husband, THOMAS B. DAVIS, as Executor of this my Last Will and Testament and hereby expressly relieve him of the necessity of giving bond as such. In the event my husband shall predecease me or be unable or unwilling to serve as Executor then and in that event I nominate and appoint UNION PLANTERS NATIONAL BANK of Memphis as Executor of this my Last Will and Testament and hereby expressly relieve it of the necessity of giving bond as such. The Trustee herein named is likewise relieved of the necessity of giving bond.

V

The Executor of this Will is authorized to sell any and all of the property that I may own at the time of my death for the purpose of raising cash to pay debts, expenses of

administration, taxes, and further for the purpose, in the event such be required, of making an equitable division in the event of the distribution to the named beneficiaries of my residual estate.


