I, CAGE SUTHERLAND, of Madison County, Mississippi, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, as follows:

ITEM ONE: I direct my Executor to pay all of my just debts, including all funeral expenses, as soon after my death as can be done conveniently.

ITEM TWO: I give, devise and bequeath unto my daughter, DEDERR CARTER, the Sam Johnson Place in Madison County, Mississippi that was acquired by me in the deeds recorded in book 70 at pages 133 and 320 of the records in the office of the Chancery Clerk of Madison County, Mississippi.

ITEM THREE: At my death there is hereby created a trust to be known as the CAGE SUTHERLAND TRUST. I give, devise and bequeath unto CANTON EXCHANGE BANK, TRUSTEE, all of the rest, residue and balance of the property of every nature and kind, wheresoever situated, of which I may die seized and possessed, after payment of all taxes and all debts and costs of the administration of my estate. The CAGE SUTHERLAND TRUST is created for the use and benefit of MALLIE KELLY, DEDERR CARTER, MARY C. FORD, ELIZABETH ALFRED, WILLIE BENNETT, and K. D. FORD; and the Trustee shall pay all expenses of this trust and shall disburse the cash of said Trust, when the same is available, in the following manner:

- (A) \$1,000.00 to K. D. Ford
- (B) \$1,000.00 to Willie Bennett
- (C) \$1,000.00 to Elizabeth Alfred
- (D) The balance of the cash shall be disbursed to MALLIE KELLY, DEDERR CARTER, and MARY C. FORD, at the rate of \$400.00 each per month for life, and upon their deaths, to their estates.

In the event that K. D. Ford, Willie Bennett, or Elizabeth Alfred predecease me, the legacy to them shall lapse and become a portion of the Trust herein created.

ITEM FOUR: In the event that Mary C. Ford is indebted to me at the time of my death, her debt shall be cancelled.

ITEM FIVE: The Trustee is hereby directed to sell all of the property owned by me at the time of my death, and this Trust shall exist so long as there are funds available for disbursement to the beneficiaries hereof or their heirs or devisees, or until January 1, 1998, whichever is the sooner, at which time all of the remaining Trust property shall pass to and become the property of DEDERR CARTER or, if she is deceased, then to her devisees, and if she leaves no Will, then to her heirs at law, per stirpes.

ITEM SIX: I designate and appoint CANTON EXCHANGE BANK, Canton, Mississippi, as Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, and to the extent that such requirement can be legally waived, the Trustee and Executor shall not be required to give any bond to serve in such capacity or capacities, nor shall said Canton Exchange Bank ever be required to obtain the order or approval of any court to exercise any power or discretion herein given.

The Trustee hereunder shall be entitled to reasonable compensation for services in administering and disbursing the trust property, and to reimbursement for expenses.

With respect to the Trust herein created, no beneficiary shall have the right, power or authority to anticipate any payments of income or corpus from this trust fund, nor shall any beneficiary have the power or authority to pledge, appoint or create a lien or encumbrance against, sell, transfer, assign, convey, give or otherwise dispose of any part of the income or corpus of this trust fund, until the same has been delivered unto the beneficiary by the Trustee, freed from the terms and conditions of this Trust, nor shall any part of said income or corpus of said trust be liable for the debts of any beneficiary or be subject to execution, attachment, garnishment, or any other process of law or equity while in the hands of the Trustee.

ITEM SEVEN: In addition to the power, privileges, titles and obligations heretofore vested in the Executor and Trustee, said Executor and Trustee shall be vested with the following power, privileges, titles and obligations, to-wit:

1. My executor and trustee is vested with the full power and authority to continue in operation any business or businesses in which I may be engaged at the time of my death, without court approval and without limitation of any kind thereasto;

2. To lease for such periods of time or to rent at such rental and for such consideration and upon such conditions as the Trustee may see fit, any real property or any minerals belonging to said trust estate;

3. The Trustee shall have full power and authority to employ auditors, attorneys, tax men, real estate agents, security brokers, and any other persons it may find advisable to use for the proper administration of this trust, and any reasonable compensation incurred for such services shall be included in and paid as expenses hereunder;

4. In the event such circumstances arise and the Trustee feels that a reasonable, prudent businessman would borrow money, then the Trustee is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow such sums as may be necessary, and to pledge, mortgage, or create a lien against any of the assets of the trust to secure such loan or loans;

5. To retain any property of my estate or any undivided interest therein, regardless of any lack of diversification, risk, or non-productivity;

6. To invest and reinvest the trust estate in any property or undivided interests therein, wherever located, including bonds, notes (secured or unsecured), stocks of corporations, real estate or any interest therein, and interests in trusts, including common trust funds, without being limited by any statute or rules of law concerning investments by Trustees;

7. To sell any trust property for cash or on credit, at public or private sale; to exchange any trust property for other property; to grant options to purchase or acquire any trust property; and to determine the prices and terms of sales, exchanges and options;

8. To keep any property in the name of a nominee with or without disclosure of any fiduciary relationship;

9. To determine the manner of ascertainment of income and principal, and the apportionment between income and principal of all receipts and disbursements, and to select any accounting period;

10. To receive additional property from any source and add it to and commingle it with the trust estate;

11. To enter into any transaction authorized by this Article with trustees or legal representatives of any other trust or estate

in which any beneficiary hereunder has any beneficial interest, even though any such trustee or legal representative is also trustee hereunder;

12. To make any distribution or division of the trust property, in cash or in kind or both; to allot different kinds or disproportionate shares of property or undivided interests in property among the beneficiaries or portions; and to determine the value of any such property; and to continue to exercise any powers and discretion herein given for a reasonable period after the termination of the trust, but only for so long as no rule of law relating to perpetuities would be violated;

13. To exercise any or all conversion, subscription, voting and other rights, privileges, elections and options, pertaining to any such property, and to grant proxies, discretionary or otherwise, in respect thereof; and to receive and retain any property that may be acquired by it as the result of the exercise of any such rights, privileges, elections or options;

I, BLAND MORROW, a resident of Davidson County, Tennessee, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make and publish this as my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills and codicils heretofore made by me.

I

I direct that all of my just debts, funeral expenses, taxes and costs of administration of my estate be paid to the extent possible out of the residuary portion of my estate.

II

I give and bequeath my household and personal effects to be divided between my sisters that survive me, and they shall agree upon such division as is satisfactory to them. In the event that they are unable to agree upon the division of any particular items, then I direct my Executors to sell such household and personal effects and to divide the proceeds from such sale equally between my surviving sisters.

III

If my sister, Cecile Allen, survives me, I give, devise and bequeath Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars to Mrs. Earl J. Walton of Madison, Mississippi, as Trustee, in trust, subject to the following terms, conditions and uses:

1. If the value of my estate is less than Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, then I give, devise and bequeath to Mrs. Earl J. Walton, as Trustee, all assets of my estate except the property mentioned in paragraph II, for the purposes set forth in paragraph III.
2. The trustee shall use the entire income from the trust for the support, maintenance, welfare and for any other purpose which

will benefit my sister, Cecile Allen. I give and grant full discretion to my trustee to make such payments to any person or firm, hospital or institution or to any one else if the trustee determines that such payment will benefit Cecile Allen. The trustee's discretion in this decision is absolute. The trustee may pay as frequently as the trustee deems it proper. The trustee may keep such funds in any bank or other institution or she may handle the assets of this trust in any way that she deems proper for the best interests of Cecile Allen.

3. I hereby give authority to the trustee to encroach on the corpus of the trust if the trustee deems it proper for the benefit of Cecile Allen and the trustee may encroach upon the entire corpus of the trust if the trustee thinks it proper. This decision is in the absolute discretion of the trustee.

4. The trustee shall in addition have all powers given to trustees under the law of the State where this trust is being executed and carried out.

5. In addition, the trustee shall have the following powers:
To make payments to or for the beneficiary, in the exercise of the trustee's sole discretion in any one or more of the following ways.

- (a) Directly to said beneficiary.
- (b) Directly in payment of the expenses of support, maintenance, welfare or institutional care of such beneficiary.
- (c) To the legal guardian of such beneficiary.
- (d) To any other person, whether or not appointed guardian of the person, who shall have the care and custody of the person of such beneficiary.

My trustee shall not be under any duty to see to the application of funds so paid, provided due care is exercised in the selection of the

person to whom such funds were paid and the receipt of such person shall be full acquittance to my trustee.

6. In addition, my trustee shall have full power and discretion to hold, mortgage, sell, convey, transfer or otherwise deal with and in assets of the trust estate and such decisions shall be at the absolute discretion of the trustee.

7. In the event that Mrs. Earl J. Walton cannot serve for any reason, then and in that event I name Mr. Earl J. Walton of Madison, Mississippi as successor trustee.

8. I do hereby waive bond for my trustee or my successor trustee. I have discussed this matter with my trustee and successor trustee and know that they do not desire to charge a fee for serving as trustee, but I do direct that they shall be reimbursed for any expenses incurred by them in carrying out the trust estate.

9. After the death of Cecile Allen, the assets, if any, remaining in the trust estate shall pass according to the provisions of paragraph IV of this Will. The trust shall end upon the death of Cecile Allen.

10. If my sister, Cecile Allen, predeceases me, then this portion of my estate shall pass in accordance with paragraph IV of this Will.

IV


