





KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that I, Eva Mary Day, of the County of Gregg and State of Texas, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and desiring to so provide for the disposition of my estate that there may be no confusion concerning the same after my death, do hereby make, declare and publish this, my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills and codicils by me at any time heretofore made.

FIRST: I will and direct that at my death I be given a funeral suitable to my circumstances and station in life, and that all my just debts, including funeral expenses and expenses of my last sickness, be paid by my Independent Executors hereinafter appointed, as soon as may conveniently be done after my death.

7. To sell any trust property for cash or on credit, at public or private sale; to exchange any trust property for other

8. To keep any property in the name of a nominee with or without disclosure of any fiduciary relationship;
