1c. So long as he may live, Henry Ater, shall have full right to lease said land for any and all purposes, including leases for oil, gas and other minerals, and shall receive the cash payments and deferred rentals.

2. Upon the death of my husband, the property described in 1a. above, and my one-half interest in the property described in 1b. above, shall go to my brother, Andrew Helm and my nephew, Atha U. Helm, not as tenants in common but as joint tenants with right of survivorship; provided further that if and when said property so descends to my brother and my nephew, my nephew, so long as his father shall live, shall see that his father is adequately and decently supported, and should the interest already vested in my brother be exhausted before his ~~father's~~ death, then the reasonable cost of such support shall be a charge against the property, and interest in the property here vested in Atha U.
