KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That I, Hilda B. Weinert, a widow, and a resident of Guadalupe County, Texas, being in good health and of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me at any time heretofore made.

I.

I hereby nominate and appoint my daughter, Jane W. Blumberg, of Guadalupe County, Texas, as Independent Executrix of this Will and Testament, and I hereby direct that no bond or other security shall be required of her. I further direct that she shall act entirely free and independent of the Courts in which this Will and Testament is probated and that no action shall be had in any Courts with reference to the management, settlement or disposition of my estate other than to probate this my Last Will and Testament, and the return of an inventory and appraisalment, and list of claims.

I direct my said Executrix to pay and discharge all of my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses as soon after my death as may be convenient. I further direct my Executrix to prepare and file any federal estate and state inheritance tax returns which may be required with reference to my estate and to pay such taxes as may be due thereunder. In the event there is not sufficient cash on hand to pay the debts, including taxes, which may be owing by my said estate, then such Executrix is authorized to sell and convey or mortgage a sufficient amount of my said estate to raise the necessary funds to discharge said debts and taxes.

In the event my appointed Executrix should refuse, or for any reason fails, to act then and in that event Seguin State Bank & Trust Company, a private corporation, of Seguin, Texas, is hereby appointed as Executor hereof, independent of the Courts, without bond, and with the same powers and authority as herein granted to the original Executrix.

II.

To my daughter, Jane W. Blumberg, I give and bequeath all of my personal household effects, wearing apparel, silverware, jewelry, rugs, paintings and furniture, and also my automobiles. And in this connection she will know what certain items I wish for her to give to others, and I have full confidence that she will distribute such items in accordance with my wishes expressed to her.

I further give and bequeath unto my daughter, Jane W. Blumberg, all of my stock, or stockholdings, in the Seguin State Bank & Trust Company, a corporation, of Seguin, Texas.


III.

For reasons known to my Executrix, I give and bequeath in cash:

- (1) To Mary Wheless Powell, the sum of \$1,000.00; and
- (2) To Linda Diane Linholm, granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Brite, the sum of \$500.00.

IV.

To Lee Pitts, my chauffer and servant, if in my employ at the time of my death, I give and bequeath the sum of \$5,000.00. My Executrix shall be the sole judge of whether or not he was in my employ at the time of my death.



V.

I give and bequeath in trust to the persons who at the time of my death compose the Board of Regents of the University of Texas, and their respective successors in office, as Trustees, the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars in cash, or in the discretion of my Executrix the equivalent thereof in bonds or other property, to be used by majority vote of the Board of Regents, then acting, exclusively for educational purposes within the State of Texas.

This donation shall be called the "HILMAR H. WEINERT MEMORIAL FUND" and the purpose of the trust to be carried out by the trustees is singly, or in any combination, the installation, erection, construction and maintenance of a room or wing to be added to and made a part of the University Memorial Museum at Austin, Texas, to house, care for and display geological exhibits, and and for a permanent type of memorial for my husband, Hilmar H. Weinert. The establishment of such addition to the University Memorial Museum shall be commenced within a reasonable time after my death, and in no event shall the commencement thereof be delayed more than three (3) years. If the purpose of this trust becomes impracticable, or if by reason of changed conditions its further execution becomes unnecessary or unwise in the judgment of the trustees, or if it should appear to the trustees that the commencement of such addition, as above provided, cannot be accomplished before the expiration of three (3) years, such trustees, acting by a majority vote, may designate another purpose which they may deem equally as, or more, appropriate under the circumstances, and the purpose so designated shall thereupon become the purpose of this trust.

This donation shall never be any part of the Permanent University Fund, nor shall the Legislature have power or be in anywise authorized to change the purpose hereof, or to divert such donation, fund, or property from the purposes here set out.

The trustees shall receive no compensation.

VI.

I give and bequeath unto Emanuel's Lutheran Church of Seguin, Texas, the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars in cash, or in the discretion of my Executrix the equivalent thereof in bonds or other property; to be used and expended in the sole discretion of the majority of the Church Council, then acting, solely and exclusively for religious, charitable or educational purposes within the State of Texas.

VII.

All the rest and residue of my property, wherever located and of whatsoever character, whether real, personal or mixed, remaining after the payment of my just debts, all special bequests herein made, testamentary expenses and all Federal and State Inheritance and Estate Taxes, I give, devise and bequeath in trust unto my daughter, Jane W. Blumberg, as Trustee for the sole and separate use and benefit of my three grandchildren, namely, CARLA ANN BLUMBERG, HILMAR DANIEL BLUMBERG, and EDWARD AUSTIN BLUMBERG. As such Trustee, my daughter, Jane W. Blumberg, shall be clothed with all of the power and authority conferred upon a trustee by the terms of the "Texas Trust Act", passed by the Legislature of the State of Texas, with amendments thereto, the same being Articles 7425b to 7425b-47 of Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, and which Act is here referred to and made a part hereof as if the same were actually copied verbatim and set forth herein. No bond or other security shall ever be required of her as Trustee hereunder, either by reason of any of the provisions of this instrument or by virtue of any of the provisions of the Texas Trust Act.

Subject to the right of the Executrix to administer the whole of my estate, my residuary estate shall immediately upon my death be delivered to

said Trustee and the Trustee shall set up three separate trusts to be known as:

THE CARLA ANN BLUMBERG TRUST,
THE HILMAR DANIEL BLUMBERG TRUST,
THE EDWARD AUSTIN BLUMBERG TRUST,

and said trusts shall each own an undivided one-third (1/3) of my said residuary estate, as herein provided.

In addition to and without in any manner limiting the powers conferred upon my Trustee by the terms of the Texas Trust Act, said Trustee shall be authorized to use so much of the income or principal from each trust estate for the support, maintenance and education of the beneficiary of such trust estate as she may deem necessary.

As each child reaches the age of thirty-five (35) years said Trustee shall deliver to such child the principal and accumulated income in the trust estate of such child. In the event any such child should die unmarried and without issue before reaching the age of thirty-five (35) years, the principal and accrued income in the trust estate of such deceased child shall be paid over in equal shares to the trust estate of the living children or to such living children if they have reached the age of thirty-five (35) years. In the event of the death of any child with issue before reaching the age of thirty-five (35) years, the principal and accrued income in the trust estate of such deceased child shall be paid over to the guardian of the child or children of such deceased child.

In the event any one or more of said children, at the date of my death, shall have reached the age of thirty-five (35) years, then I give, devise and bequeath directly to said child or children the interest in my estate hereinabove devised to the trust created in my Will for said child or children.

VIII.

In the event Jane W. Blumberg should refuse, or for any reason fails, to act as Trustee hereunder, then and in that event Seguin State Bank & Trust Company, a private corporation, of Seguin, Texas, is hereby appointed Trustee of each of the Trust Estates herein created, independent of the Courts, without bond, and with the same powers and authority as herein granted to the original Trustee.

IX.

Without in any manner limiting the powers herein given, I hereby grant to my Executrix or Alternate Executor and to my Trustee or Alternate Trustee hereunder, the following specific or permissive powers and authority in addition to and not in substitution of the powers otherwise herein conferred or as contained in The Texas Trust Act, as it now stands, or as it might hereafter be amended, to-wit:

(a) To execute and deliver oil, gas and mineral leases, surface leases, pooling and/or unitization agreements, development contracts separately or jointly, transfer orders and division orders, deeds, assignments or other evidences of title, covering and affecting properties belonging to my estate, upon such terms and conditions as to such Executor or Trustee may appear to be to the best interest of my estate;

(b) To receive for the benefit of said estate all proceeds and monies derived from the sale of oil, gas or any other minerals produced from said properties and to execute proper receipts therefor;

(c) My said Executor is authorized to execute all such deeds, assignments, transfers and other instruments to the Trustee hereunder as may be necessary to effectuate transfer of title;

(d) To enter into contracts for, or undertake in their fiduciary capacity, the exploration, development and operation of existing oil, gas and mineral leases, or for oil, gas or mineral leases hereafter acquired, either separately or jointly;

(e) To enter into contracts with others, or undertake the same in their fiduciary capacity, the explorations, development and operation of existing producing properties; to water-flood, re-drill, or in any other manner further explore, develop or operate the same; to enter into the required and necessary functions for the secondary recovery of oil, gas or other minerals from producing or non-producing properties, all under any such terms, conditions and provisions as to such Executor or Trustee might seem proper or expedient under the circumstances and without liability to any of the beneficiaries by reason thereof;

(f) Any such contracts, agreements, leases, or arrangements to be valid and binding for the full term thereof even though same shall extend beyond the duration of either or all of the trusts herein created.

X.

In the event an ancillary administration is required upon that portion of my estate consisting of properties located in the State of Illinois, I hereby nominate and appoint M. J. Williams as Executor under this Will insofar as an administration is required in the State of Illinois with reference to my properties located in said state and I direct that no bond or other security shall be required of him, and that no further action shall be had in the Courts of said state other than to probate this Will and administer upon the properties located within the State of Illinois as required by the laws of said state.

I, Hilda B. Weinert, a widow, a resident of the City of Seguin, Guadalupe County, Texas, publish and declare that this is the first codicil to my last will and testament, which is dated the 23rd day of August, 1968, and executed by me in the presence of Lula Black, Marvin Smith and Joyce Magin.

I

I revoke and annul Paragraph V of my last will and testament which reads as follows:

I give and bequeath in trust to the persons who at the time of my death compose the Board of Regents of the University of Texas, and their respective successors in office, as Trustees, the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars in cash, or in the discretion of my Executrix the equivalent thereof in bonds or other property, to be used by majority vote of the Board of Regents, then acting, exclusively for educational purposes within the State of Texas.

This donation shall be called the "HILMAR H. WEINERT MEMORIAL FUND" and the purpose of the trust to be carried out by the trustees is singly, or in any combination, the installation, erection, construction and maintenance of a room or wing to be added to and made a part of the University Memorial Museum at Austin, Texas, to house, care for and display geological exhibits, and for a permanent type of memorial for my husband, Hilmar H. Weinert. The establishment of such addition to the University Memorial Museum shall be commenced within a reasonable time after my death, and in no event shall the commencement thereof be delayed more than three (3) years. If the purpose of this trust becomes impracticable, or if by reason of changed conditions its further execution becomes unnecessary or unwise in the judgment of the trustees, or if it should appear to the trustees that the commencement of such addition, as above provided, cannot be accomplished before the expiration of three (3) years, such trustees, acting by a majority vote, may designate another purpose which they may deem equally as, or more, appropriate under the circumstances, and the purpose so designated shall thereupon become the purpose of this trust.

This donation shall never be any part of the Permanent University Fund, nor shall the Legislature have power or be in anywise authorized to change the purpose hereof, or to divert such donation, fund, or property from the purposes here set out. The trustees shall receive no compensation.

I provide that said sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars shall not be given in trust to the Board of Regents of the University of Texas as provided in Paragraph 7 of my last will and testament but said Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars shall become part of my residue estate.

II





5. To retain any property of my estate or any undivided interest therein, regardless of any lack of diversification, risk or non-productivity;

6. To invest and reinvest the trust estate in any real property or undivided interests therein, wherever located;

7. To sell any trust property for cash or on credit, at public or private sale; to exchange any trust property for other property; to grant options to purchase or acquire any trust property; and to determine the prices and terms of sales, exchanges and options;

8. To determine the manner of ascertainment of income and principal, and the apportionment between income and principal of all receipts and disbursements, and to select any accounting period;

9. To receive additional property from any source and add it to and commingle it with the trust estate;

10. To make any distribution or division of the trust property in cash or in kind, or both; and to allot different kinds of disproportionate shares of property or undivided interests in property among the beneficiaries or portions, and to determine the value of any such property; and to continue to exercise any powers and discretion herein given for a reasonable period after the termination of the trust, but only for so long as no rule of law relating to perpetuities would be violated;

11. To exercise any or all conversion, subscription, voting and other rights, privileges, elections and options, pertaining to any such property, and to grant proxies, discretionary or otherwise, in respect thereof; and to receive and retain any property that may be acquired by the Trustee as the result of the exercise of any such rights, privileges, elections or options;

12. To extend the time of payment of any obligation, including accrued or accruing interest, held by him hereunder;

13. To make partition, division or distribution of property in kind and, for any such purpose, to determine the value of any such property;

14. To execute oil, gas and mineral leases, royalty and mineral deeds, or other contracts and agreements pertaining to minerals or royalties, covering or pertaining to any trust property on such terms and conditions as they may deem advisable;

15. To perform any and all such other acts, and to take any and all such other proceedings and to exercise all such other rights and privileges in respect to any property as if they were the absolute owner thereof and in connection therewith to enter into any and all agreements binding my estate or any trust hereunder.

ITEM THREE

In the event that L. L. Sprinkell fails, refuses or neglects for any purpose, to act as Trustee under this my Last Will and Testament, then, in that event, A. R.
