I, Edwin C. Steijen, of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, being over the age of twenty-one years, and of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, and not under the restraint or undue influence of any person, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills and codicils by me made.

ITEM I

I appoint as the co-Executors and co-Trustees hereunder my beloved wife, Willard S. Steijen, and The First National Bank of Jackson, Jackson, Mississippi.

If my said wife shall fail to qualify or cease or become unable so to serve for any reason, then said Bank or its successor or successors shall act alone in either or both of such capacities.

If my corporate Executor or corporate Trustee should resign or refuse or decline to serve in either capacity, then the Chancery Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, is authorized to appoint another corporate Executor or corporate Trustee, as the case may be, in lieu of the corporate Executor or corporate Trustee herein named, such successor corporate Executor or corporate Trustee, however, to be a banking corporation authorized to do and doing a trust business in the State of Mississippi.

My Executors and Trustees and their successors, if any, shall be entitled to a reasonable compensation for their services in administering and distributing the estate and trust property under this Will, and to reimbursement for their reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

To the extent that such requirement can be legally waived, I direct that no Executor or Trustee or successor Executor or successor Trustee

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appointed in accordance with these provisions shall be required to furnish any bond or other security in any jurisdiction for the faithful performance of his or her or its duties.

ITEM II

I direct my Executors to pay out of the assets of my estate all of my just debts, probated against my estate, my funeral expenses and all costs of administration of my estate and to pay out of the property which would otherwise become a part of the Residuary Trusts hereinafter established, all estate, inheritance, transfer and succession taxes, including interest and penalties thereon, which may be lawfully assessed by reason of my death. I hereby waive on behalf of my estate any right to recover any part of such taxes or penalties from any person, including any beneficiary of insurance on my life and anyone who may have received from me or from my estate any property which is taxable as a part of my estate.

ITEM III

I give and bequeath to my sister, Mrs. Alvild Parker, if she survives me, the sum of Five Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$5,000.00). My said sister's present post office address is 286 West Main Road, Portsmouth, Rhode Island.

ITEM IV

I give and bequeath to my son, Charles McConnell Steijen, if he survives me, forty-four (44) shares of stock in Koeneman Electric Company, Inc., a Mississippi corporation.

ITEM V

In recognition of the many years of faithful service rendered by him as an employee of Koeneman Electric Company, Inc., a Mississippi

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corporation, of which corporation I am the principal stockholder, I give and bequeath to my friend, Robert M. Cupit, forty-four (44) shares of the corporation, provided, at the time of my death, he is still in the employ of the corporation, and on the condition that when he leaves the employ of the corporation, either by death, resignation or otherwise, the corporation shall have the option of purchasing the said forty-four (44) shares of stock within a period of ninety (90) days after he ceases to be in the employ of the corporation, either by death, resignation or otherwise, at the book value of said stock as of the close of business on the last day of the month preceding the last day he is in the employ of the corporation. In arriving at the book value of the stock no value will be placed on the goodwill of the corporation. The book value of the stock shall be determined by the independent certified public accountant regularly maintained by the corporation to audit its books. If no such accountant is available, or if he fails to make a determination of such value, the value shall be determined by any other certified public accountant selected by the owners of a majority of the stock of said corporation.

In case at the time of my death the said Robert M. Cupit is not in the employ of said corporation, then I direct that the shares to which he would have been entitled had he remained in such employ be divided equally between my son, Charles, and my said wife.

If the said Robert M. Cupit takes under this Item V of my Will, my Executors shall, by appropriate endorsement on the stock certificate to be delivered to the said Robert M. Cupit, clearly set forth that the ownership of the stock evidenced by said certificate is subject to all the terms and conditions set forth in this Item V of my Will affecting said stock.

ITEM VI

In recognition of the many years of faithful service rendered by him as an employee of Koeneman Electric Company, Inc., a Mississippi corporation, of which corporation I am the principal stockholder, I give and bequeath to my friend, Leslie E. Cardwell, Sr., forty-four (44)

shares of the corporation, provided, at the time of my death, he is still in the employ of the corporation, and on the condition that when he leaves the employ of the corporation, either by death, resignation or otherwise, the corporation shall have the option of purchasing the said forty-four (44) shares of stock within a period of ninety (90) days after he ceases to be in the employ of the corporation, either by death, resignation or otherwise, at the book value of said stock as of the close of business on the last day of the month preceding the last day he is in the employ of the corporation. In arriving at the book value of the stock no value will be placed on the goodwill of the corporation. In case at the time of my death the said Leslie E. Cardwell, Sr. is not in the employ of said corporation, then I direct that the shares to which he would have been entitled had he remained in such employ be divided equally between my son, Charles, and my said wife.

If the said Leslie E. Cardwell, Sr. takes under this Item VI of my Will, my Executors shall, by appropriate endorsement on the stock certificate to be delivered to the said Leslie E. Cardwell, Sr., clearly set forth that the ownership of the stock evidenced by said certificate is subject to all the terms and conditions set forth in this Item VI of my Will affecting said stock.

ITEM VII

I give and bequeath to my said wife, if she survives me, forty-seven (47) shares of stock in Koeneman Electric Company, Inc., a Mississippi corporation.

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ITEM VIII

I give and bequeath to my said wife, if she survives me, all of my household furniture and furnishings, books, pictures, objects of art, silverware, jewelry, clothing and other such personal effects belonging to me at the time of my death and all automobiles that I may own at the time of my death. In the event my said wife should not survive me, then I hereby give and bequeath all of the above mentioned items to my children, Charles McConnell Steijen and Mrs. Dianna Steijen Himel, to be divided equally between them as they may determine, but if they fail to agree upon such division within a period of six (6) months after my death, then as my Executors shall determine.

ITEM IX

I give, devise and bequeath to my said wife, if she survives me, all of my right, title and interest in and to the home we are occupying as our homestead at the time of my death.

ITEM X

I give, devise and bequeath to my said wife, Willard S. Steijen, if she shall survive me, property equal in value to the maximum marital deduction allowable under the Federal estate tax laws with reference to my estate, provided, however, that the amount so devised and bequeathed shall be reduced by the value of the property qualifying for said marital deduction which passes or has passed to my said wife either under provisions of this Will or outside of this Will (including life insurance payable to her as named beneficiary, and bank accounts, bonds and real property owned by my said wife and me as joint tenants with full rights of survivorship). No assets shall be included within this devise and bequest which do not qualify for said marital deduction. The determination as to what property of my estate shall constitute this devise and bequest

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shall be left to the sole discretion of my corporate Executor, but the cash and other property selected in satisfaction of such devise and bequest shall have an aggregate fair market value fairly representative of the distributee's proportionate share of the appreciation or depreciation in the value to the date, or dates, of distribution of all property then available for distribution. All values shall be those finally determined for Federal estate tax purposes. The amount of assets comprising this devise and bequest shall be determined before there is a reduction of my estate by reason of inheritance, estate or transfer taxes due by reason of my death. This gift shall abate to the extent that it cannot be satisfied in the manner hereinabove provided. The exercise of the foregoing power and discretion by my corporate Executor shall not be subject to question by or on behalf of any beneficiary under this Will regardless of its effect upon the interests of such beneficiary.

ITEM XI

All the residue of my property of whatsoever kind and wheresoever situated (including all lapsed legacies and devises, and any property over which I may have a power of appointment at the time of my death) I give, devise and bequeath to my Trustees in trust, for the uses and purposes hereinafter set forth. This trust fund shall be called the "Residuary Trusts" and shall be divided, held, administered and disposed of as follows:

1. My Trustees shall divide the trust property into equal, separate shares so as to provide one share for each child of mine living at the time of my death and one share for the then living lawful descendants, per stirpes, of each then deceased child of mine. The share or portion of a share allocated to each beneficiary shall constitute and be administered as a separate trust. Separate books and records shall be kept for each such trust but it shall not be necessary that physical division of the assets be made as to each trust.

2. The income and corpus of each trust shall be held, administered and disposed of as hereinafter provided.

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3. If my said wife survives me, then during her lifetime my Trustees shall distribute to or for her benefit so much or all of the income and corpus of the Residuary Trusts, in proportionate shares from each trust, as in the sole discretion of my corporate Trustee shall be necessary or advisable for her support, health and general welfare, taking into consideration the standard of living to which she is accustomed at the time of my death and all other income and cash resources known to my corporate Trustee to be available to her for such purposes. My Trustees may also distribute to or for the benefit of each of my descendants, or to my wife for their benefit, so much of the income and corpus of the Residuary Trusts, in proportionate shares from each trust, as in the discretion of my corporate Trustee may be necessary or advisable for their support, medical care, education and general welfare, taking into consideration the standard of living to which each is accustomed at the time of my death and all other income and cash resources known to my corporate Trustee to be available to each for such purposes. All income not so distributed shall be accumulated and added to the corpus of each separate trust.

4. Upon the death of my wife, if she survives me, or upon receipt of the Residuary Trust fund by my Trustee if she does not survive me, the Residuary Trusts, as then constituted, shall be held, administered and disposed of as follows:

a. My Trustee shall distribute to or for the benefit of the beneficiary of each Residuary Trust so much of the income and corpus thereof as my corporate Trustee, in its sole discretion, shall consider necessary or advisable for the health, support, education and general welfare of each such beneficiary and his or her spouse and descendants, taking into consideration the standard of living to which each is accustomed at that time and all other income and cash resources known to my corporate Trustee to be available to them for such purposes.

b. My Trustee shall distribute to or for the benefit of the beneficiary of each Residuary Trust such part of or all

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of the following portions of the remaining corpus and undistributed income thereof as he or she shall request in writing at or after the following designated times:

1) One-third part, at the then market value thereof, forthwith upon the death of my wife, if she survives me, or if she does not survive me, then upon the settlement of my estate and the receipt of the trust assets by my Trustee, or four years after my death, whichever event or date shall first occur; provided, however, that no such distribution shall be made until such beneficiary shall have attained the age of twenty-five (25) years.

2) One-half part of the remainder (exclusive of any portion subject to withdrawal after attaining age twenty-five (25)), at the then market value thereof, five years after the date set for such first distribution.

3) All of the remainder five years after the date set for such second distribution.

The Residuary Trusts shall terminate as to each beneficiary when all of the share of such beneficiary shall have been so distributed or upon the prior death of such beneficiary.

c. If any beneficiary of the Residuary Trusts shall die before complete distribution of his or her share, then upon the death of the survivor of such beneficiary and my wife the share of such beneficiary as then constituted shall be distributed to such of my then surviving descendants, or to the widow of any deceased male descendant of mine, in such proportions and subject to such terms, trusts and conditions as such beneficiary may appoint (without violating any applicable rule against perpetuities or accumulations) by specific reference to this power in the valid last Will of such beneficiary. Such power shall not be exercised in favor of the creditors of such beneficiary or his or her estate or the creditors thereof.

d. To the extent that the foregoing testamentary power of

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appointment is not effectually exercised by any beneficiary, then upon the death of the survivor of such beneficiary and my wife, the share of such beneficiary as then constituted, or the part thereof not effectually appointed, shall be forthwith distributed to his or her then living descendants equally, per stirpes, or if none, then equally per stirpes to my then living descendants, or if none, then to my heirs-at-law, whose identity and respective shares shall be determined as hereinafter set out; provided, however, that any portion otherwise distributable to a descendant of mine for whom any property is then being held in trust hereunder shall be added thereto; and provided further, that if any portion shall become distributable to a minor for whom no property is then being held in trust hereunder, then such portion shall immediately vest in such minor but my Trustee shall retain possession thereof until such minor becomes twenty-one (21) years of age, and in the meantime my Trustee shall use and expend so much of the income and corpus of such retained portion as my Trustee shall deem necessary or advisable for the health, support, education and general welfare of such minor. Any income not so expended shall be added to the corpus. My Trustee shall have with respect to each such retained portion all of the power and discretion had with respect to the Residuary Trusts generally.

5. No individual Trustee who is a beneficiary of the Residuary Trusts created hereunder shall have the right to vote on or in any manner participate in a decision to make a distribution or allotment of the income or corpus of the trust fund to or for his or her benefit or to or for the benefit of any person whom such individual Trustee is legally obligated to support.

ITEM XII

Any share or portion of a share of any trust created hereunder or any other property of mine that is not disposed of under any other

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provision of this Will, shall go and be distributed to my heirs-at-law. Their identity and respective shares shall be determined in all respects as if my death had occurred immediately following the happening of the event requiring such distribution, and according to the laws of Mississippi then in force governing the distribution of the estate of an intestate.

ITEM XIII

No interest of any beneficiary in the corpus or income of my estate or of any trust created hereunder shall be subject to assignment, alienation, pledge, attachment or claims of creditors of such beneficiary and may not otherwise be voluntarily or involuntarily alienated or encumbered by such beneficiary, except as may be otherwise expressly provided herein.

ITEM XIV

If any trust created hereunder shall violate any applicable rule against perpetuities, accumulations or any similar rule or law, my Trustees are hereby directed to terminate such trust on the date limited by such rule or law and thereupon the property held in such trust shall be distributed to the persons then entitled to share the income therefrom in the proportions in which they are then entitled to share such income, notwithstanding any provisions of this Will to the contrary. No power of appointment granted hereunder shall be so exercised as to violate any such applicable rule or law and any attempted exercise of any such power which violates same shall be void, notwithstanding any provision of this Will to the contrary.

ITEM XV

Any mortgage, lien or other encumbrance upon any property bequeathed or devised hereunder, either outright or in trust, shall be assumed by the legatee, devisee or trustee of such property.

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ITEM XVI

If my wife and I should die under such circumstances that the order of our deaths cannot be established by proof, it shall be conclusively presumed for all purposes of this Will that my wife survived me.

ITEM XVII

If any provisions of this Will shall be unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall nevertheless be carried into effect.

ITEM XVIII

I give and grant to my Executors and Trustees appointed hereunder and their successors, hereinafter sometimes called my "fiduciaries," the following powers, duties and discretion in addition to those now or hereafter conferred by law, to be exercised in their absolute discretion in any capacity to which such powers may be applicable:

1. My corporate fiduciary shall have the sole custody of all securities, papers, personal property and cash comprising my probate or trust estate and may solely perform all ministerial duties.

2. To hold, manage, lease, care for, and protect the estate or trust property and collect the income therefrom, all in accordance with their best judgment and discretion, being fully authorized to cause any securities or other property, real or personal, belonging to my estate or trust, to be held or registered in the name of any one or more or all of my fiduciaries, or in the name of their nominee, or in such other form as they deem best, without disclosing the trust relationship; to invest and reinvest the trust property in bonds, stocks, mortgages, notes, insurance policies, annuities, common trust fund participations, or other property of any kind, real or personal, irrespective of any statute, case, rule, or custom limiting the investment of trust

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funds; to extend or renew any indebtedness; to sell at public or private sale and convey any and all of the trust or estate property and any reinvestments thereof from time to time for such price and upon such terms as they shall see fit; to borrow money for any purpose from any source, including but not limited to any trust established by me during my lifetime, upon such terms and security as they shall deem advisable; to sell any estate or trust property to any trust created by me during my lifetime for such price and upon such terms as my fiduciaries shall deem advisable, notwithstanding my fiduciaries (or any of them) may also be the fiduciaries (or any of the fiduciaries) of such inter vivos trust created by me; to mortgage or pledge any estate or trust property; to settle, compromise, contest, prosecute or abandon claims in favor of or against my estate or any trust as they may deem advisable; to set up reserves of any kind out of income, and to determine, irrespective of any statute or rule of law, how all receipts, disbursements, charges, and credits shall be credited, charged or apportioned as between income and corpus; to vote, either in person or by general or limited proxy, or refrain from voting, any corporate securities for any purpose and exercise or sell any subscription or conversion rights therein; to consent to or join in any voting trusts, reorganizations, consolidations, mergers, foreclosures, and liquidations; to deposit securities with or under the direction of any protective committee under such terms as my fiduciaries may deem advisable and to accept and hold any securities or other property received through the exercise of any of the foregoing powers; to continue and operate any business or interest therein which I may own at the time of my death for such time as they shall deem advisable; to engage in any other business; to become or remain a partner, general or special, in any business; to incorporate any of such businesses and hold the stock thereof as an investment; to provide capital for and employ agents to manage and operate any of said businesses without liability for the acts of any such agent or for any loss, liability, or indebtedness resulting from the operation thereof if the management is selected or retained with reasonable care; and to deduct from the income of any trust hereunder a reserve for

depreciation on any depreciable asset held in trust or to authorize the income beneficiaries thereof to take such deduction or to apportion such deduction between my Trustees and the income beneficiaries in such manner as my Trustees shall deem proper. Any leases that may be made may commence at the time of making or on a future day and may be for any period of time my fiduciaries think best, though extending beyond the term of any trust.

3. Whenever my fiduciaries are required to divide the estate or trust property into separate trusts or shares, or to make distribution thereof, they are authorized in their sole discretion to make division or distribution wholly or partly in cash or kind, to assign undivided interests in any trust property to the several trusts or shares and to make joint investments of funds belonging to the several trusts or shares. The judgment of my Trustees as to values for such purposes shall be binding and conclusive on everyone.

4. When required to make a distribution or transfer of all or a part of the assets of my estate or of any trust created hereunder, my fiduciaries may retain therefrom assets sufficient in their judgment to cover any liability which may then or later be imposed upon them, including but not limited to their liability for estate, income, or other taxes, until such liability shall have been finally determined.

5. Whenever my fiduciaries shall have the right to elect whether any item of expense connected with the administration of my estate or of any trust herein created shall be claimed as a deduction for Federal Income Tax purposes or whether the same shall be claimed instead as a deduction for Federal Estate Tax purposes, I hereby authorize my fiduciaries to exercise such right of election in such manner as they may in their absolute discretion determine to be advisable, even though the manner in which such election is exercised may result in an advantage or disadvantage to any beneficiary or beneficiaries hereunder as compared with any other beneficiary or beneficiaries hereunder.

6. Any successor fiduciary shall be clothed and vested with all the duties, rights and powers, whether discretionary or otherwise, as if

originally named as such fiduciary. No successor fiduciary shall be liable or responsible in any way for any acts or defaults of any predecessor fiduciary, nor for any loss or expense from or occasioned by anything done or neglected to be done by any predecessor fiduciary but such successor fiduciary shall be liable only for his, her, or its own acts and defaults in respect to property actually received by such successor fiduciary.

7. If any corporate fiduciary at any time acting hereunder shall be merged or consolidated with or shall sell or transfer substantially all of its assets and business to another corporation or shall be in any manner reorganized or reincorporated, then the corporation resulting therefrom or the corporation to which such sale or transfer shall have been made shall thereupon become the successor fiduciary hereunder without the execution of any instrument and without any further act on the part of any fiduciary or beneficiary hereunder, provided that such successor is a banking corporation authorized to do a trust business in the State of Mississippi.

8. My fiduciaries may execute and deliver any written instruments which they may deem advisable to carry out any power granted to them. All persons shall be fully protected in relying upon the power of my fiduciaries to execute every such instrument and no one shall be obligated to see to the application by my fiduciaries of any money or property received by them pursuant to the execution and delivery of any such instrument.

9. It is not my intention that the assets of any trust shall be conserved for the benefit of remaindermen. On the contrary, my primary purpose in creating all trusts is to provide for the income beneficiaries. The rights and interests of remaindermen are subordinate and incidental to that purpose. Neither is it my intention to encourage extravagance on the part of any beneficiary nor an aversion to work on the part of any male beneficiary. Therefore, my fiduciaries, in exercising their discretion as to whether to make distributions of the income or corpus of any trust to or for the benefit of any beneficiary for his or her

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support, education, health or general welfare shall take into consideration the standard of living to which such beneficiary is then accustomed and all other income and resources available to such beneficiary for such purposes from all sources known to my fiduciaries, together with any other factors which my fiduciaries may deem pertinent. All dividends received, whether in the form of cash or additional stock, shall by the Trustee be considered and dealt with as trust income and not as an addition to trust corpus.

10. In disposing of any share of any trust created hereunder, my fiduciaries shall be fully protected in relying upon an instrument purporting to be the last Will of any beneficiary of any such trust if such instrument shall have been admitted to probate and is valid according to the law of the domicile of such beneficiary or in acting upon the assumption that such beneficiary shall have died intestate if my fiduciaries shall have no notice of the existence of such Will of such beneficiary within three months after his or her death.

11. I authorize my Executors to join with my wife in filing any Federal income tax return for any year in which such joinder is permitted by law and to pay all or such ratable share of any taxes due thereon as my Executors shall deem proper. I further authorize my Executors to consent to any gifts made by my wife during my lifetime as having been made one-half by me for the purpose of any Federal gift tax law. The exercise of such authority by my Executors shall be final and conclusive and not subject to question by any person.

12. Any power and right granted to my fiduciaries may be exercised by them without posting any bond, without obtaining any order from or the approval of any court, without any notice to or consent of anyone and my fiduciaries shall not be required to make any report to any court at any time for any purpose.

13. My fiduciaries shall render to the income beneficiaries of all trusts created hereunder statements of account of receipts and disbursements at least annually.

14. My fiduciaries are hereby directed to carry out the terms of any agreement I may have entered into to sell all or any part of any

property or any interest I may own in any business at the time of my death.

15. Any power granted to my fiduciaries shall be void to the extent that its exercise shall cause my estate to lose all or any part of the tax benefit afforded by the marital deduction under Federal or state laws.

16. If my fiduciaries determine that any income or corpus shall be paid to a minor or to a person under legal disability or to a person not adjudicated incompetent, but who, by reason of illness or mental or physical disability, is in the opinion of my fiduciaries unable properly to administer such amounts, then such amounts may be paid out by my fiduciaries in such of the following ways as they deem best: (1) directly to such beneficiary; (2) to the legally appointed guardian or conservator of such beneficiary; (3) to some relative or friend for the care, support and education of such beneficiary; (4) by my fiduciaries using such amounts directly for the benefit of such beneficiary.

ITEM XIX

All references to my children or descendants and issue are intended to include children of mine born after the execution of this Will and such afterborn children shall have no rights in my estate other than those granted by this Will. As used herein, the terms "child," "children," "descendant," "descendants" and "issue" are intended to include any person adopted by me or by any child or descendant of mine, and his descendants. At the date of the execution of this Will the names of my wife and children are as follows: Mrs. Willard S. Steijen, wife; Charles McConnell Steijen, son; and Mrs. Dianna Steijen Himel, daughter.
