McMILLON, and I have no right to dispose of them but hereby confirm her title thereto insofar as is necessary.

To my said wife, DORIS, I give and bequeath any automobiles I may own at the time of my death.

ITEM II.

I give and bequeath all my clothing, jewelry, hunting, fishing and allied equipment to my son, BEN LLOYD McMILLON, JR.

ITEM III.

In the event that my said wife, DORIS W. McMILLON, survives me, I give, devise and bequeath to BEN LLOYD McMILLON, JR., as Trustee for my said wife,

subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, property equal in value to the maximum marital deduction allowable under the federal estate tax laws with reference to my estate, provided, however, that the amount so devised and bequeathed shall be reduced by the value of the property qualified for the federal marital deduction which passes or has passed to my said wife either under other provisions of this will or outside of this will (including life insurance payable to her as named beneficiary, and bank accounts, bonds, real property owned by my said wife and me as joint tenants with full right of survivorship). No assets shall be included within this devise and bequest which do not qualify for said marital deduction. In making the computations necessary to determine the amount of this pecuniary estate tax marital deduction bequest, values as finally determined for federal estate tax purposes shall control. The payment of this amount may be made wholly or partly in kind by transferring to my said wife, DORIS W. McILLON, assets at values current at the date of distribution.

As part of the property herein conveyed to my trustee, I devise and bequeath to him all my right, title and interest in and to all livestock, draft and work animals, farm equipment, trucks, wagons, farm tools, and farm supplies.

This trust shall be known as the DORIS W. McILLON TRUST. Said DORIS W. McILLON TRUST shall be administered by said Trustee as follows:

A. Said Trustee shall pay to my said wife, during her lifetime, all of the income of the trust in periodic installments, the frequency of such payments to be determined by the Trustee, except that in no event shall such payments be made less frequently than quarterly.

B. If the total income of my said wife is, in the sole discretion of the Trustee, insufficient to enable her to maintain her present standard of living, or if, in the sole discretion of the Trustee, an emergency has arisen, then the Trustee may pay to her out of the principal of the trust

such additional sum or sums as the Trustee shall deem proper. In making this determination, the Trustee may take into consideration my said wife's assets and income from sources other than this trust. The Trustee is also authorized to pay any and all medical, nursing, hospital or other related bills which may be incurred by my said wife, out of income or corpus, or both.

C. By way of illustration and not of limitation of his powers, I hereby authorize the Trustee to exercise full power and authority:

1. To sell, transfer, convey, mortgage, lease and dispose of the trust property upon such terms and in such manner and for such prices as the Trustee shall deem proper.

2. To manage and control the trust property, with power to invest and reinvest the same in such property as he shall, in his sole discretion, deem proper, and to do all things necessary or incidental to the investment or reinvestment of the trust property of the estate and the collection of income therefrom.

3. To retain, with no obligation to sell, any property coming into his hands as Trustee under the terms of this instrument, and the Trustee may, in his sole judgment, continue to hold and retain any and all of the investments, securities and property which may come into his hands by virtue of this trust, whether or not the same would be treated as legal for the investment of trust funds.

4. To expend from the income, rents, profits, dividends and/or proceeds from sales of the trust property the necessary expenses of administering this trust, including taxes, Trustee's fees and attorneys' fees.

5. To complete, extend, modify or renew any loans, notes mortgages, contracts or other obligations which I may owe, in such manner as it may deem advisable.

6. To pay, settle or compromise all claims and obligations held by or asserted against said trust, all in such manner and upon such terms as it may deem advisable.

7. To exercise all conversion, subscription, voting and other rights pertaining to securities held in the trust.

8. To carry on or liquidate my farm and livestock operation as he sees fit.

9. To enter into operating agreements or other contracts for the exploration and development of oil, gas and mineral interests.

10. To permit available trust funds to remain temporarily uninvested, or, in its discretion, to place on time deposit in a Savings Account, cash funds coming into its hands which the Trustee deems it desirable to accumulate for use at a given time in the future in connection with the administration of the trust. The depository for such deposits should preferably be the Canton Exchange Bank, Canton, Mississippi, or one of the Savings and Loan Associations in Canton or Jackson, Mississippi, but in all events is to be one located within the State of Mississippi.

11. Upon the death of my said wife, the entire remaining corpus and all accrued income of the JONIS B. McILLON TRUST shall be paid over to such appointee or appointees, or to the estate of my said wife, free of any trust created in this will, in the manner and proportions as my said wife may designate and appoint in her Last Will and Testament, by naming specific

reference therein to this Item of my Will, as the source of the power. The power of appointment herein granted to my said wife shall be exercisable by her alone and in all events. Upon the death of my said wife, DORIS W. McMILLON, and in the event that she shall default in the exercise of the power of appointment herein granted to her, the entire remaining corpus and all accrued income of the DORIS W. E. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this my Will, I direct: (1) That in the event of any uncertainty regarding the interpretation of the provisions of this trust for my wife, it is my intention that its provisions shall be interpreted in a manner which would permit the assets of this trust to qualify for the marital deduction authorized by the United States Internal Revenue Code, as now or hereafter amended; and (2) That none of the powers granted to the Trustee by this Will shall be exercised in such a manner as to disqualify this trust or any part thereof from the marital deduction allowable in determining the Federal estate tax on my estate; and (3) That the amount of assets comprising this devise and bequest shall be determined before there is a reduction of my estate by reason of inheritance, estate or transfer taxes due by reason of my death; no such estate or inheritance taxes shall be paid from this devise and bequest but said taxes shall be paid from my residuary estate.
