

JAMES BENNETT GRACE, SR. then in that event the property of DR. JAMES BENNETT GRACE, SR. shall vest in and become the property of JOSEPHINE D. GRACE.

V.

It is our further joint will that upon the death of both of us, that then and in that event, we will, devise and bequeath all of our property, real, personal and mixed unto our children then living, equally, to share and share alike. In the event any of our children has predeceased us, then their interest shall vest in their children to share and share alike.





ITEM ONE: I desire that all of my just debts be paid as soon after my death as can be done conveniently.



A. All of my corporeal, tangible, personal property, including my clothing, books, jewelry, automobiles and other items of personal use and adornment; and if she shall not survive me, I give and bequeath all of the said property to my surviving children, share and share alike.

B. I do hereby recognize and acknowledge all of the right, title and interest in and to our homestead located at Route 1, Box 410-C in Madison County, Madison, Mississippi 39110, which is now and has been for many years past the property of my said wife and I do hereby acknowledge and confirm that my said wife is the owner of all improvements situated thereon together with all household furniture, carpets, rugs, books, pictures, silverware, linen, china, jewelry and all other personal effects contained in said residence.

I devise and bequeath to my said wife, Mrs. Ella Margaret Thomas, if she shall survive me, property equal in value to the maximum marital deduction allowable under the Federal estate tax laws with reference to my estate, provided, however, that the amount so devised and bequeathed shall be reduced by the value of the property qualifying for said marital deduction which passes or has passed to my said wife either under other provisions of this Will or outside of this Will (including life insurance payable to her as named beneficiary, and bank accounts, bonds and real property owned by my said wife and me as joint tenants with full rights of survivorship). No assets shall be included within this devise and bequest which do not qualify for said marital deduction. The determination as to what property of my estate shall constitute this devise and bequest shall be

left to the sole discretion of the Executor, but the cash and other property selected in satisfaction of such devise and bequest shall have an aggregate fair market value fairly representative of the distributee's proportionate share of the appreciation or depreciation in the value to the date, or dates of distribution of all property then available for distribution. All values shall be those finally determined for Federal estate tax purposes. The amount of assets comprising this devise and bequest shall be determined before there is a reduction of my estate by reason of inheritance, estate or transfer taxes due by reason of my death.

ITEM V

If my said wife, Mrs. Ella Margaret Thomas, shall survive me, I hereby give, bequeath and devise all the rest and residue of the property comprising my estate, whether real, personal or mixed and where ever situated, to the Deposit Guaranty National Bank of Jackson, Mississippi, in Trust, nevertheless, for the following uses and purposes and upon the following terms and conditions:

A. Except as hereinafter qualified, the Trustee shall pay all the net income to my wife in convenient installments periodically, at least as often as annually, during her life. However, the Trustee may in its discretion withhold from my wife so much of the income as the Trustee determines not to be required for her support, comfort and welfare, or for any other purpose the Trustee believes to be to her best interest, but the Trustee need not consider the interests of any other beneficiary in determining whether to withhold income. The Trustee may in its discretion pay to one or more of my descendants so much of any withheld income as the Trustee determines to be required or desirable for his or their support, comfort, education and welfare, or for any other purpose the Trustee believes to be to his or their

best interests. Any excess income shall be added to principal at the discretion of the Trustee.

B. If the total income of my said wife is, in the sole discretion of the Trustee, insufficient to enable her to maintain her present standard of living, or if, in the sole discretion of the Trustee, an emergency has arisen, then the Trustee may pay to her out of the principal of the trust such additional sum or sums as the Trustee shall deem proper. In making this determination, the Trustee may take into consideration my said wife's assets and income from sources other than this trust. The Trustee is also authorized to pay any and all medical, nursing, hospital or other related bills which may be incurred by my said wife, out of income or corpus, or both.

C. The Trustee shall have full power and authority to invest and reinvest the principal of the trust in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as the Trustee may see fit, notwithstanding any legal or statutory requirements as to investments by Trustees and with express authority to invest funds in a common trust fund established by the Trustee pursuant to the Uniform Common Trust Fund Act of Mississippi; to sell, exchange, pledge, mortgage, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of any property, real or personal, originally or subsequently acquired; to retain and hold in unchanged form any property, real or personal, coming into its hands; to rent or lease any of the properties embraced within the trust, upon such terms and conditions as the Trustee deems advisable; to make all determinations respecting division, allotments, and distributions of income and principal to the beneficiary; to pay taxes of every kind existing against the trust property; to employ such agents and attorneys as are usual and necessary; to hold investments in the name of a nominee; and to do all other acts which, in the judgment

of the Trustee, may be necessary or appropriate for the proper and advantageous management, investment and distribution of the trust estate to the same extent as though it were the sole owner of the trust property. The Trustee shall not be held responsible for loss occurring where it has exercised good faith and reasonable diligence. No purchaser, mortgagor or other person, firm or corporation need see to the application of funds paid or advanced to the Trustee in connection with the business or purposes of the trust, but the receipt of the Trustee therefor shall be a complete acquittance and discharge. The Trustee may permit trust funds to remain temporarily uninvested, or in its discretion, to place on time deposit in a savings account in the Deposit Guaranty National Bank, Jackson, Mississippi, cash funds coming into its hands which the Trustee deems it desirable to accumulate for use at a given time in the future in connection with the administration of the trust.

D. Neither the principal nor the income of the trust fund, nor any part of same, shall be liable for the debts of my said wife, or for my children hereinafter mentioned, nor shall the same be subject to seizure by any creditor of my said wife or children, and they shall not have any power to sell, assign, transfer, convey, encumber, or in any manner to anticipate or dispose of their interests in the trust fund, or any part of same or the income produced from said fund, or any part the same.

F. This is a private trust, and the Trustee shall not be required to obtain the order or approval of any court for the exercise of any power or discretion herein given. The Trustee shall not be required to return to any court any periodic formal accounting of its administration of the trust, but said Trustee shall render annual accounts to my said wife. No person paying money or delivering property to the Trustee shall be required to see to its application. Bond shall not be required of the Trustee.

G.
