SAMUEL L. RIDDELL

I, SAMUEL L. RIDDELL, an adult resident citizen of Madison County, Mississippi, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke any and all other wills and codicils heretofore made by me.

ITEM I.

I direct my Executrix to pay all of my just debts and obligations which may be probated, registered and allowed against my estate as soon as may be conveniently done.

ITEM II.

To my wife, BELLE H. RIDDELL (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "my wife"), if she be living at my death, I devise and bequeath the following:


A. Any interest I may own in our residence which is occupied by us as a family home.

B. Any cash, personal bank accounts, automobiles, clothing books, jewelry and other personal effects which I may own at my death.

If my wife shall not survive me, I devise and bequeath the aforesaid assets as provided in Item IV hereof.

ITEM III.

To my said wife I give, devise and bequeath property equivalent in value to one-half (1/2) of my adjusted gross estate as finally determined for federal estate tax purposes, less the

aggregate value of the marital deduction, if any, allowed for such tax purposes by reason of any interest in insurance or in jointly owned property or in other property or interest in property passing under any other item of this Will or having passed to my wife other than by this Will. In satisfaction of this bequest, I direct my Executrix to distribute to my said wife any interest I may own in our residence. The balance of such bequest shall be made up of such assets as the Executrix may determine. However, the Executrix shall not distribute to my wife in satisfaction of this bequest any property which would not qualify for the marital deduction allowable in determining the federal estate tax on my estate.

It is my intention hereby to convey to my wife the maximum value of property, but no more, that when added to other property passing to my wife other than by this Item of my Will, shall result in the maximum marital deduction available under the applicable Internal Revenue Code provisions. In distributing assets to my wife in accordance with the provisions of this Item of my Will my Executrix shall value the assets so distributed at their values current on the date or dates of distribution.

None of the assets herein conveyed to my wife shall be used for the payment of any estate, inheritance or death taxes that shall become payable upon, or by reason of, my death.

ITEM IV.

After setting aside the assets to satisfy the bequests previously made herein the Executrix shall pay all estate and inheritance taxes payable by reason of my death. The rest and residue of my estate I give, devise and bequeath as follows:

A. To ALICE R. HART, ANNICE R. CHANCELLOR, ALLENE R. WALTERS and ELIZABETH JANE R. LEWIS, in equal shares, share and share alike, the forty (40) acres, more or less, situated in Choctaw County, Mississippi; the mineral interest in realty situated in Montgomery County, Mississippi; and the lots situated in the City of Canton, Madison County, Mississippi.

B. To ALICE R. HART, ALLENE R. WALTERS and ELIZABETH JANE R. LEWIS, as Trustees, the farm land situated in Madison County, Mississippi, in trust for the use and benefit in equal shares, share and share alike, of the following: ALICE R. HART, WILMA HART, BETTY LOU H. WATKINS, LOUIS W. HART, JANIS H. WHITE, SAM RIDDELL HART, ANNICE R. CHANCELLOR, JAY CHANCELLOR, DELL CHANCELLOR, PRENTISS CHANCELLOR, ALLENE R. WALTERS, SAMMY L. WALTERS, ALAN WALTERS, ADRAINNE WALTERS, ELIZABETH JANE RIDDELL LEWIS, JOHN LEWIS, JIM LEWIS and ELIZABETH LEWIS.

In the event that either of the above named Trustees shall not be willing or able to serve as such, then ANNICE R. CHANCELLOR is hereby appointed Trustee, with all of the powers and authority accruing to such office as herein set forth.

Such Trustees are hereby vested with broad discretionary powers and authority to rent, lease or otherwise make use of the property involved, under such terms, conditions and circumstances as they may determine to be in the best interest of the parties involved. The Trustees are charged with the responsibility of paying all taxes and assessments against the property. It is the intent of the undersigned that the Trustees shall have the authority to do any and all things necessary or incidental to the full management of the property involved, and to take the income

therefrom and utilize same in whatever manner they deem necessary to maintain the said place and to invest same, or distribute same, or any portion thereof, to the parties named, in equal shares.

The Trustees named, with the consent and concurrence of ALICE R. HART, ANNICE R. CHANCELLOR, ALLENE R. WALTERS and ELIZABETH JANE R. LEWIS, individually, shall have the right to sell, mortgage or otherwise encumber the place, or convey the property under such terms and for such consideration as they deem reasonable and sufficient; in which event, the proceeds from such sale shall be divided equally among all the parties involved.

Should any of the parties named above decease during the life of the trust, then the share of the deceased party shall go to her or his brothers and sisters and in the case of the death of our daughters, the share of such deceased daughter shall go to her children.

When the youngest of the parties living shall attain the age of twenty-one, this trust shall terminate, and the proceeds remaining shall be distributed to those living in equal shares, and the property, if same be not sooner sold or disposed of, shall vest in those living, in equal shares, share and share alike.

It is specifically understood that the Trustees named shall have the authority and power to execute oil, gas and mineral leases covering the property involved, to receive and receipt from the payee for such leases, and to hold, invest, use or distribute such income as herein provided.

In discharging the duties and responsibilities as Trustees, it shall not be necessary or required that a bond be posted, or that same be administered by the Court.



ITEM V.



I, JOHN H. MOON, an adult resident citizen of Madison County, Mississippi, being above the age of twenty-one years and of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others by me heretofore made:

ITEM I.

I designate and appoint MISSISSIPPI BANK & TRUST COMPANY, Jackson, Mississippi, and TOM C. BROWN as Co-Executors of my estate. I have named TOM C. BROWN Co-Executor in order that he may advise MISSISSIPPI BANK & TRUST COMPANY, Jackson, Mississippi, on all matters of importance both personal and business related to the administration of my estate. I direct that MISSISSIPPI BANK & TRUST COMPANY shall keep all records, books of account, and prepare all inventories and accountings to be filed.

ITEM II.

D. In distributing income of any trust contained herein the Trustee, in its sole discretion, may distribute income of the trust in cash or in kind. In making distributions of both principal and income of any trust contained herein the Trustee, in its sole direction, may make a non-pro rata distribution of property in kind. The judgment of the Trustee concerning values and purposes of such division or distribution of the property or securities held in the trust shall be binding and conclusive on all parties interested therein.

ITEM VIII.

A. 


