That I, ANNE BURNETT TANDY, of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas, do hereby make, declare and publish this to be my Second Codicil to my Last Will and Testament dated November 6, 1975, as heretofore amended by Codicil dated August 23, 1978, and do hereby revoke any other codicils other than said Codicil of August 23, 1978.

1.

Because of the death of my beloved husband, Charles D. Tandy, I hereby do substitute the name of PAUL MASON for Charles D. Tandy as a Trustee of the Trusts created under Articles 4 and 5 of my Will and as a successor co-Independent or co-Executor under Article 6 of my Will. However, inasmuch as Paul Mason is an employee of The First National Bank of Fort Worth, or its parent, First United Bancorporation, Inc., or both, I direct that in his capacity as Trustee he shall not participate in the voting of any of my stock of First United Bancorporation, Inc.

2.

I hereby add another two sentences to Paragraph 4(E) of Article 4 of my Will, which two sentences shall read as follows:

"Upon acceptance by a successor Trustee, any Trustee may resign from a Trust without the necessity of any court procedure after giving at least thirty (30) days' written notice to each beneficiary (or to the then natural or legal guardian or legal representative of any such beneficiary) who might then be entitled to receive a distribution from such Trust Estate, and by accounting to such resigning Trustee's successor Trustee for the administration of the Trust Estate as required by the successor Trustee. Any and all successors to such resigning Trustee shall be fully protected in relying upon such accounting."

ABT

I hereby add the following Paragraph K to Article 5 of my Will, which paragraph shall read as follows:

"K. Anne Windfohr Meeker shall become a Trustee of this Trust when she obtains the age of 21 and so long as both Anne Windfohr Phillips and Anne Windfohr Meeker are serving there shall be five Trustees of this Trust. In the event of the death, resignation or inability to serve of Anne Windfohr Phillips as Trustee prior to the time Anne Windfohr Meeker obtains the age of 21, then such individual as Anne Windfohr Phillips may have designated as her successor by an instrument in writing filed with the other Trustees shall succeed Anne Windfohr Phillips as a Trustee of this Trust, to serve until Anne Windfohr Meeker becomes 21, at which time such person shall cease to serve as Trustee and Anne Windfohr Meeker shall become a Trustee of this Trust, but if Anne Windfohr Meeker should for any reason not qualify as Trustee, such person shall continue to serve as a Trustee. In the event of the death, resignation or inability to serve of Anne Windfohr Phillips after Anne Windfohr Meeker has become a Trustee of this Trust, the position of Anne Windfohr Phillips shall not be filled, and in the event of the death, resignation or inability to serve of Anne Windfohr Meeker, her position shall not be filled. In the event of the death, resignation or inability to serve of either Edward R. Hudson, Jr., George Beggs III, or Paul Mason, as a Trustee, such individual as such Trustee may have designated by an instrument in writing filed with the other Trustees shall succeed as a Trustee of this Trust, and each of said Trustees and his successors in interest shall have the power and authority to designate an individual as his or her successor as Trustee of this Trust by an instrument in writing filed with the other Trustees, and the individual so designated shall thereupon become a Trustee of this Trust upon the death, resignation or inability to serve of the person appointing him or her. In default of the appointment of a successor Trustee, the remaining Trustees or Trustee at any time serving shall have the power and authority to fill any vacancy in the Trustees of this Trust so that there will always be three individual Trustees of such Trust. Upon acceptance by a successor Trustee, any Trustee may resign from a Trust without the necessity of any court procedure after giving at least thirty (30) days' written notice to each beneficiary (or to the then natural or legal guardian or legal representative of any such beneficiary) who might then be entitled to receive a distribution from such Trust Estate, and by accounting to such resigning Trustee's successor Trustee for the administration of the Trust Estate as required by the successor Trustee. Any and all successors to such resigning Trustee shall be fully protected in relying upon such accounting."

ORDER ADMITTING WILL, FIRST CODICIL AND
SECOND CODICIL TO PROBATE AND AUTHORIZING LETTERS
TESTAMENTARY

On this day came on to be heard the Application for Probate of Will, and First and Second Codicils thereto, and for issuance of Letters Testamentary filed by ANNE WINDFOHR PHILLIPS and FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF FORT WORTH ("Applicants") in the Estate of ANNE BURNETT TANDY, Deceased ("Decedent").

The Court, having heard the evidence and having reviewed the Will and such two Codicils and other documents filed herein, finds that the allegations contained in the Application are true; that notice and citation have been given in the manner and for the length of time required by law; that Decedent is dead, having died on January 1, 1980, and that four years have not elapsed since the date of Decedent's death; that this Court has jurisdiction and venue of the Decedent's estate; that Decedent left a Will dated November 6, 1975, a First Codicil to said Will dated August 23, 1978, and a Second Codicil to said Will dated January 13, 1979, all executed with the formalities and solemnities and under the circumstances required by law to make them a valid Will and valid Codicils thereto, respectively; that on each such date Decedent had attained the age of eighteen years and was of sound mind; that none of such Will and First and Second Codicils thereto was revoked by Decedent; that no objection to or contest of the probate of such Will or First and Second Codicils thereto has been filed; that all of the necessary proof required for the probate of such Will and First and Second Codicils thereto has been made; that such Will and First and Second Codicils thereto are entitled to probate;

that in said Will, Decedent named ANNE WINDFOHR PHILLIPS and FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF FORT WORTH as Independent Executors to serve without bond, who are duly qualified to act as such Independent Executors and to receive Letters Testamentary, and that they are not disqualified by law to act as such Independent Executors or to receive Letters Testamentary; that neither of such Codicils affected the appointments of ANNE WINDFOHR PHILLIPS or FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF FORT WORTH as such Independent Executors; and that a necessity exists for the administration of this estate.

It is therefore ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that such Will and First and Second Codicils thereto are admitted to probate, and the Clerk of this Court is ORDERED to record such Will and First and Second Codicils thereto, together with the Application, in the Minutes of this Court.

It is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that no bond or other security is required and that upon the taking and filing of the Oath required by law, Letters Testamentary shall issue to ANNE WINDFOHR PHILLIPS and FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF FORT WORTH, who are appointed as Independent Executors of Decedent's Will and Codicils and Estate, and no other action shall be had in this Court other than the return of an Inventory, Appraisement and List of Claims as required by law.
