my wife by operation of law. If I am mistaken as to this, I hereby give and devise to my wife, BERNICE P. FINK, any and all interest I may have in said homeplace, if she survives me.

ITEM IV. All of my personal effects and articles of a personal nature, including any automobile that I may own, I give and devise to my wife, BERNICE, if she survives me.

ITEM V. I give and devise to BERNICE P. FINK, if she survives me, as trustee, without bond, an amount equal in value to the maximum estate tax marital deduction (allowable in determining the Federal Estate Tax on my estate) diminished by the value for Federal Estate Tax purposes of all other items in my gross estate which qualify for the estate tax marital deduction and which pass or have passed to my wife under other provisions of this Will, or otherwise. My Executrix shall allocate and distribute to Trustee the assets which shall constitute this marital trust; provided, however, that only assets which qualify for the Federal Estate Tax marital deduction shall be allocated and distributed to Trustee in satisfaction of this marital devise. Any assets included in my estate and distributed to Trustee in kind to satisfy this marital devise shall be valued for that purpose at their values as finally determined for Federal Estate Tax purposes, and any other assets so distributed shall be valued for that purpose at their cost. The assets so allocated and distributed shall have an aggregate fair market value on the date or dates of distribution of not less than the amount of this marital devise as finally determined for Federal Estate Tax purpose.

This trust shall be known as the Marital Trust and shall be held, administered and disposed of as follows:

All of the income, commencing from the date of my death, shall be paid to my wife in convenient installments, at least as often as quarterly, during her lifetime.

In addition to income, Trustee is authorized to pay to my wife all or such sums from the principal or corpus of this trust as is requested by my wife in writing from time to time during the continuation of this trust.

My wife, BERNICE, is hereby vested with the power to appoint, free of trust, the entire remaining corpus of said trust estate in the hands of the Trustee at her death, to pass by such appointment at her death as part of her estate, which power of appointment shall exist immediately upon and following my death and shall be exercisable at any time thereafter in favor of the estate of my wife or in favor of others as she may appoint and shall be exercisable by her alone and in all events as follows:

- (a) By written instrument or instruments executed and acknowledged by her at any time and from time to time and delivered to the Trustee during her life; or
- (b) By Last Will and Testament duly executed by her; or
- (c) If there is any part of the corpus as to which my said wife has failed to exercise her power of appointment in the manner provided for in (a) and (b) above, then the same, at her death, shall pass in trust to those beneficiaries provided for in Item VI the same as if originally a part of the trust created therein.

It is my express intent in making this bequest to obtain for the benefit of my estate the marital deduction therefor in determining the estate tax due and payable on my estate,

and all interpretations of this Will and decisions thereunder shall be made accordingly.

ITEM VI. All the rest and residue of my estate, real or personal and wherever situated, after the payment of debts, expenses, taxes and devises as provided in Items I through V above, I give, devise and bequest to BERNICE P. FINK, if she survives me, as Trustee, without bond, in trust for the following uses and purposes:

Trustee is to pay to my wife, BERNICE, during her lifetime, all of the income from this trust in convenient installments at least as often as quarterly.

This trust shall terminate upon the death of my wife, and all remaining principal or corpus and accumulated income, if any, shall go fifty percent (50%) to my son, MICHAEL FINK, and fifty percent (50%) shall to to the FIRST TENNESSEE BANK N.A. MEMPHIS, as Trustee, without bond, in a separate trust for the following uses and purposes:

This trust shall be known as the EMILY ANN FINK trust and shall be held, administered and disposed of as follows:

Trustee is instructed to invest any funds coming into its hands only in the following types of investments:

- (1) United States Government Obligations;
- (2) Federal Savings and Loan Association, savings accounts or certificates;
- (3) National Bank savings accounts or certificates; or
- (4) Grade A or better bonds.

All of the income, beginning with the death of my wife, or with my death if my wife does not survive me, shall be paid to my daughter, EMILY ANN FINK, in convenient installments, at least as often as quarterly.

In addition to income, Trustee, in its sole discretion, is authorized to pay to my daughter such sums from the principal or corpus of this trust as it deems necessary or desirable to enable her to maintain the standard of living to which she has become accustomed.

The trust shall terminate upon my daughter attaining the age of fifty (50), and the principal, corpus and accumulated income, if any, shall thereupon be delivered to my daughter free of trust.

In the event of the death of either my son or my daughter prior to the termination of either of above trusts, without them having received his or her share, said deceased child's descendants then living, if any, shall take such child's share, per stirpes.

In the event such deceased child leaves no descendants, then my other child and his or her descendants, if such other child also be dead at such time, shall be entitled to the entire trust estate or estates.

If any person, in whom any part of a trust share would otherwise vest under any of the foregoing provisions, following the death of either of my children, has not attained the age of twenty-one (21) years, the share or interest of such person under twenty-one (21) years of age

The Trustee may use or apply the income from such trust share for such minor beneficiary in its discretion as may be necessary for the education, comfort and support of such person. When such person attains the age of twenty-one (21) years, such trust as to the share or interest of such person shall terminate and the principal or corpus and accumulated income, if any, shall thereupon be paid over by Trustee to such person free of trust.

The receipt of any beneficiary or such person or associations to whom payments are made for the benefit of any beneficiary of any of the trusts created by this Will shall be full and complete acquittance to Trustee without the necessity of the legal appointment of a guardian for such person.

ITEM VII. During the administration of my estate and the term of the foregoing trusts, under the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated Section 35-616, there is incorporated herein by reference, the language contained in Tennessee Code Annotated Section 35-618. My Executrix and Trustee shall have and may exercise where applicable all the powers therein enumerated.

The above powers of Trustee are, with respect to the trust created by Item V of this Will, expressly subject to the provisions of said Item V, and nothing is to be placed in the "Marital Trust" that will not qualify for the marital deduction.

Anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, no fiduciary or fiduciaries acting under any power granted herein shall have authority to take any action (such as keeping assets in liquid form, uninvested or retaining non-income producing assets or investing therein) which might or would cause the value of the marital gift hereunder to fail to qualify for the appropriate Federal Estate Tax marital deduction.

ITEM VIII. If my wife, BERNICE, and I shall die as the result of a common disaster, or otherwise under such circumstances that it cannot be determined which of us died first, it shall be presumed that my wife survived me.

In the event my wife predeceases me, I direct that my entire estate shall go to those beneficiaries and under the same terms as set forth in Item VI of this my Last Will and Testament, as would take there on termination of the trust created for the life benefit of my wife, that is fifty percent (50%) to my son, MICHAEL, and fifty percent (50%) in trust for my daughter, EMILY ANN.

ITEM IX. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife, BERNICE P. FINK, as Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament, and I expressly relieve her from the necessity of giving bond.

In the event of the inability, failure or refusal of my wife to qualify or act as Executrix, I name, constitute and appoint my son, MICHAEL FINK, as Successor Executor and as Successor Trustee without bond and if he is a non-resident of Tennessee then I name, and constitute and appoint JAMES L. DALLAS as Co-Executor and Co-Trustee to serve with my

son, MICHAEL, without bond, with all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities as if originally named herein.
