



I, NELL SPEIGHTS BARBER, of Madison County, Mississippi hereby declare this to be my will and revoke any other wills and codicils which I may have made.

ARTICLE I
PAYMENT OF TAXES

I direct that all estate, inheritance, transfer, legacy or succession taxes which may be imposed with respect to my estate or on any part wheresoever situated whether or not passing under my will shall be paid out of my residuary estate and such payment shall be made as an expense of administration and without apportionment.

ARTICLE II
BEQUESTS OF PERSONAL EFFECTS

A. I devise and bequeath to Jessie Hall the sport jacket and rifle which my husband previously owned.

B. I devise and bequeath to Louise Payne my antique chair, the clock on my mantel at my residence, 403 Spike Ridge, Canton, Mississippi, and my dinette set.

C. I devise and bequeath to D. Jane Speights the automobile which I own at the time of my death.

D. I devise and bequeath to Louise Hall one drop leaf table, one vanity and one chest of drawers.

E. I devise and bequeath to my niece, D. Jane Speights, all of my diamond rings.

F. I devise and bequeath to my niece, D. Jane Speights and to Louise Payne, my dog, Tuffy.

ARTICLE III
CASH BEQUESTS

I give and bequeath the following legacies to the following persons:

- A. To Louise Speights Hall, the sum of \$3,000.00.
- B. To Fannie B. Thompson, the sum of \$20,000.00.
- C. To W. Jenkins Barber, the sum of \$5,000.00.
- D. To J. Byron Barber, the sum of \$10,000.00.
- E. To Lorene Fite, the sum of \$15,000.00.
- F. To Kay Taylor, the sum of \$20,000.00.
- G. To Frances and Wilson Taylor, the sum of \$15,000.00, share and share alike.
- H. To Tom Taylor, the sum of \$2,000.00.
- I. To Ken Taylor, the sum of \$2,000.00.
- J. To Louise Payne the sum of \$8,463.00.

If any of these beneficiaries predecease me, I give and bequeath his or her legacy in equal shares to those of his or her children who are living at my death or if there are no such children then the legacy of such deceased beneficiary shall become part of my residuary estate. If my estate shall be insufficient to pay these legacies in full, I direct that they shall abate proportionately.

ARTICLE IV
SPECIFIC DEVISES

A. I devise and bequeath to my niece, D. Jane Speights, all of my right, title and interest to my residence located at 403 Spike Ridge, Canton, Mississippi together with all tangible personal property located therein and not previously bequeathed in another article of my will.

B. I devise and bequeath to my nephew, W. A. "Sonny" Speights, the two real estate lots which I own in Harleton, Texas. I have

previously given to my nephew a mobile home as part of his inheritance from me.

C. I give and bequeath to Louise Payne the mortgage executed in my favor by Kenneth and Margaret Sewell on the property located in Pass Christian, Mississippi. This bequest is to include all payments whether of principal or interest accrued on this mortgage at the date of my death.

D. I give and bequeath to D. Jane Speights the mortgage executed in my favor by William Glynn Martin and wife on the property located at 356 Lake Harbor Road, Brandon, Mississippi. This bequest is to include all payments whether of principal or interest accrued on this mortgage at the date of my death.

ARTICLE V
IN TERROREM CLAUSE

Should any taker under this will, including any taker under powers of appointment exercised herein, become an adverse party in a proceeding for its probate, such taker shall forfeit his entire interest hereunder and such interest shall pass as part of the residue of my estate, provided, however, that if such taker is one of the takers of the residue, his interest shall be divided proportionately among the other takers of the residue. This paragraph shall not be construed to limit the appearance by any taker as a witness in any proceeding for the probate of this will, nor to limit his appearance in any capacity in a proceeding for its construction.

ARTICLE VI
RESIDUARY ESTATE

All of the residue of my property of whatsoever kind and wheresoever situated (including all lapsed legacies and devises, but

expressly excluding any property over which I may have a power of appointment at the time of my death, I give, devise and bequeath to D. Jane Speights and Louise Payne, share and share alike.

ARTICLE VII
APPOINTMENT OF FIDUCIARIES

I appoint as Executrix of this will, D. Jane Speights, to serve without bond, inventory, appraisal or accounting to any court and to have all the powers as are granted to trustees under the Mississippi Uniform Trustees' Powers Act, including the power to sell real or personal property at public or private sale without court order.
